1 AN ACT Relating to state agencies; amending RCW 66.16.040; and
2 adding a new section to chapter 43.17 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.17 RCW
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) All state agencies and offices may accept payment from any
7 individual using a personal credit card in the normal course of state
8 business.

9 (2) A personal credit card may only be used if that credit card
10 does not rely on the credit of the state of Washington, as prohibited
11 under Article VIII, section 5 of the state Constitution.

12 (3) The director, secretary, or agency head shall, in accordance
13 with RCW 43.17.060, adopt rules to guide his or her agency's policy
14 regarding the acceptance and use of personal credit cards.

1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 66.16.040 and 1981 1st ex.s. c 5 s 8 are each amended
2 to read as follows:

3 Except as otherwise provided by law, an employee in a state liquor
4 store or agency may sell liquor to any person of legal age to purchase
5 alcoholic beverages and may also sell to holders of permits such liquor
6 as may be purchased under such permits.

7 Where there may be a question of a person's right to purchase
8 liquor by reason of age, such person shall be required to present any
9 one of the following officially issued cards of identification which
10 shows his/her correct age and bears his/her signature and photograph:

11 (1) Liquor control authority card of identification of any state or
12 province of Canada.

13 (2) Driver's license, instruction permit or identification card of
14 any state or province of Canada, or "identocard" issued by the
15 Washington state department of licensing pursuant to RCW 46.20.117.

16 (3) United States active duty military identification.

17 (4) Passport.

18 (5) Merchant Marine identification card issued by the United States
19 Coast Guard.

20 The board may adopt such regulations as it deems proper covering the
21 acceptance of such cards of identification.

22 No liquor sold under this section shall be delivered until the
23 purchaser has paid for the liquor in cash. The purchaser may use his
24 or her personal credit card to buy liquor so long as that card does not
25 rely upon the credit of the state, as prohibited by Article VIII,
26 section 5 of the state Constitution.
