1            AN ACT Relating to the state patrol highway account; amending RCW  
2 43.08.250; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.08.250 and 1993 sp.s. c 24 s 917 are each amended  
5 to read as follows:

6            The money received by the state treasurer from fees, fines,  
7 forfeitures, penalties, reimbursements, or assessments, except for  
8 fees, fines, forfeitures, penalties, reimbursements, or assessments  
9 under chapters 46.32, 46.37, 46.44, and 46.48 RCW and RCW 46.16.010, by  
10 any court organized under Title 3 or 35 RCW, or chapter 2.08 RCW, shall  
11 be deposited in the public safety and education account which is hereby  
12 created in the state treasury. The legislature shall appropriate the  
13 funds in the account to promote traffic safety education, highway  
14 safety, criminal justice training, crime victims' compensation,  
15 judicial education, the judicial information system, civil  
16 representation of indigent persons, winter recreation parking, and  
17 state game programs. During the fiscal biennium ending June 30, 1995,  
18 the legislature may appropriate moneys from the public safety and  
19 education account for purposes of appellate indigent defense, the

1 criminal litigation unit of the attorney general's office, sexual  
2 assault treatment, operations of the office of administrator for the  
3 courts, and Washington state patrol criminal justice activities.  
4 Moneys received under chapters 46.32, 46.37, 46.44, and 46.48 RCW and  
5 RCW 46.16.010 shall be deposited in the state patrol highway account.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate  
7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
8 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take  
9 effect May 1, 1994.
