1 AN ACT Relating to acquisition of public art; and amending RCW
2 43.17.200.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.17.200 and 1983 c 204 s 4 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, all state
7 agencies including all state departments, boards, councils,
8 commissions, and quasi public corporations shall allocate, as a
9 nondeductible item, out of any moneys appropriated for the original
10 construction of any public building, an amount of one-half of one
11 percent of the appropriation to be expended by the Washington state
12 arts commission for the acquisition of works of art created by
13 Washington state artists. The works of art may be placed on public
14 lands, integral to or attached to a public building or structure,
15 detached within or outside a public building or structure, part of a
16 portable exhibition or collection, part of a temporary exhibition, or
17 loaned or exhibited in other public facilities. In addition to the
18 cost of the works of art the one-half of one percent of the
19 appropriation as provided herein shall be used to provide for the

1 administration of the visual arts program by the Washington state arts
2 commission and all costs for installation of the works of art. For the
3 purpose of this section building shall not include highway construction
4 sheds, warehouses, or other buildings of a temporary nature.

5 (2) Subsection (1) of this section shall not apply to the
6 construction of any facility under the control of the department of
7 corrections and used for the incarceration, treatment, or
8 rehabilitation of convicted persons, or any facility under the control
9 of the department of social and health services and used for juvenile
10 rehabilitation.

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
