- 18 addresses that are included in an approved application under this
- 19 chapter and for which the applicant requests confidentiality."
- 20 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. APPLICATION. An adult person, a parent or
- 21 guardian acting on behalf of a minor, or a guardian acting on behalf of
- 22 an incapacitated person, as defined in RCW 11.88.010, may apply to the
- 23 secretary of state to have the office of the secretary of state serve
- 24 as the person's address or the address of the minor or incapacitated
- 25 person. The secretary of state shall approve an application if it is
- 26 filed in the manner and on the form prescribed by the secretary of
- 27 state and if it contains:

- 1 (1) A sworn statement by the applicant that the applicant has good 2 reason to believe (a) that the applicant, or the minor or incapacitated 3 person on whose behalf the application is made, is under serious threat 4 of becoming a victim of domestic violence; (b) that the use of the 5 secretary of state's office as an address and the restrictions on
- 7 victimization; and (c) that the address or addresses designated in

disclosure provided under this chapter would reduce the risk of such

- 10 (2) A designation of the secretary of state as agent for purposes

- 19 (5) The signature of the applicant and of any individual or
- 20 representative of any office designated in writing under section 7 of
- 21 this act who assisted in the preparation of the application."
- 22 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. APPROVAL OF APPLICATION BY SECRETARY OF
- 23 STATE--ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE--DURATION. (1) Upon approval of an
- 24 application filed under section 3 of this act, the secretary of state
- 25 shall issue a certificate to the applicant recognizing the applicant's
- 26 permission to use the office of the secretary of state as the
- 27 applicant's address, or as the address of any other person for whom the
- 28 application was filed. The certificate shall contain the name of the
- 29 person issued the certificate; the name of the person with the
- 30 protected address; a statement that the office of the secretary of

- 1 state is the official address of the person with the protected address;
- 2 and a listing of the secretary of state's office address to be used.
- 3 (2) A certificate is effective for a period of one year following
- 4 its issuance, except under the following circumstances:
- 5 (a) The certificate will become ineffective if, and as of the time
- 6 that, the person for whom the certificate is granted obtains a change
- 7 of name; and
- 8 (b) A change in address listed on the application will render the
- 9 certificate ineffective, unless the certificate holder provides the
- 10 secretary of state with seven days' advance notice of the change of
- 11 address.
- 12 (3) The secretary of state may cancel the certificate if mail
- 13 forwarded by the secretary to that address is returned as
- 14 nondeliverable.
- 15 (4) A certificate obtained though false information is void.
- 16 (4) This section does not apply to a voter's address provided to
- 17 the county auditor for purposes of registering to vote or for any
- 18 voting purpose."
- 19 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. ADOPTION OF RULES--USE OF SECRETARY OF
- 20 STATE'S ADDRESS. The secretary of state shall adopt rules permitting
- 21 a current certificate holder, or person for whom a current certificate
- 22 is obtained, to use the secretary of state's address in lieu of the
- 23 protected address. This permission extends to all communications and
- 24 transactions, except for those communications and transactions relating
- 25 to voting. The secretary of state shall forward all mail or other
- 26 materials sent to the secretary of state for a person with a protected
- 27 address to the mailing address provided in the approved application.
- 28 The secretary of state may send such mail or materials by United States
- 29 postal service, or other alternative methods approved by the secretary
- 30 of state."

- 1 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. DISCLOSURE RESTRICTIONS. The secretary of
- 2 state may not make a protected address available for inspection or
- 3 copying, except under the following circumstances: (1) When requested
- 4 by a law enforcement agency, to the law enforcement agency; and (2)
- 5 when directed by court order, to a person identified in the order."
- 6 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. CHAPTER ADMINISTERED BY SECRETARY OF STATE-
- 7 -ASSISTANCE TO APPLICANTS. (1) The secretary of state shall administer
- 8 this chapter and adopt rules for its effective administration.
- 9 (2) Through interlocal or other agreements, the secretary of state
- 10 may designate and authorize state and local agencies and nonprofit
- 11 entities which provide counseling and shelter services to victims of
- 12 domestic violence to assist applicants for a certificate under this
- 13 chapter. Any assistance and counseling rendered by the office of the
- 14 secretary of state or its designees to applicants shall in no way be
- 15 construed as legal advice.
- 16 (3) The secretary of state shall serve as the agent for service of
- 17 process on each person with a current protected address."
- 18 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. CAPTIONS NOT LAW. Section captions as used
- 19 in this chapter do not constitute any part of the law."
- 20 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. A new section is added to chapter 29.36 RCW
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 (1) The county auditor shall place on ongoing absentee status any
- 23 voter with a protected address, as defined under section 2 of this act,
- 24 who submits to the county auditor a copy of the certificate issued
- 25 under section 3 of this act and requests the county auditor to place
- 26 the voter on such status.
- 27 (2) The county auditor may not disclose a protected address of a
- 28 voter placed on ongoing absentee status under subsection (1) of this

- 1 section, except under the following circumstances: (a) When requested
- 2 by a law enforcement agency, to the law enforcement agency; and (b)
- 3 when directed by court order, to a person identified in the order.
- 4 (3) A voter placed on ongoing absentee status under this section
- 5 shall remain on such status for as long as the voter's address is a
- 6 protected address. Such voter shall be subject to the same
- 7 restrictions as other voters placed on such status, except that
- 8 termination of the status shall not occur on January 1st of each odd-
- 9 numbered year."
