- 12 postsecondary students about the costs of attending college and
- 13 available financial aid.
- 14 (2) For the state need grant program under RCW 28B.10 790 through
- 15 28B.10.824: As funds are available, expand the program to include new
- 16 populations of resident students in the following priority order:
- 17 (a) Low-income undergraduates;
- 18 (b) Lower middle-income undergraduates;
- 19 (c) Middle-income undergraduates; and
- 20 (d) Resident graduate and professional students, following the
- 21 income priorities established for undergraduate students.
- 22 (3) For the state work study program under chapter 28B.12 RCW:
- 23 Increase employment opportunities including off-campus job
- 24 opportunities with community service employers.
- 25 (4) For the future teachers' conditional scholarship program under
- 26 chapter 28B.102 RCW: Expand program eligibility to include teachers
- 27 pursuing a master's degree for continuing certification.
- 28 (5) For students whose parents did not attend college: Determine
- 29 the feasibility of providing grants to needy first generation
- 30 scholars."
