- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the
- 8 development and commercialization of new technology is a vital part of
- 9 economic development.
- 10 The legislature also finds that it is in the interests of the state
- 11 of Washington to provide a mechanism to transfer and apply research and
- 12 technology developed at the institutions of higher education to the
- 13 private sector in order to create new products and technologies which
- 14 provide job opportunities in advanced technology for the citizens of
- 15 this state.
- 16 It is the intent of the legislature that the University of
- 17 Washington, the Washington State University, and the department of
- 18 trade and economic development work cooperatively with the private
- 19 sector in the development and implementation of a world class
- 20 technology transfer program."
- 21 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. Unless the context clearly requires
- 22 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout RCW
- 23 28B.20.285 and sections 3 through 8 of this act.
- 24 (1) "Technology center" means the Washington technology center,
- 25 including the affiliated staff, faculty, facilities, and research
- 26 centers operated by the technology center.

- 1 (2) "Board" means the board of directors of the Washington 2 technology center.
- 3 (3) "High technology" or "technology" includes but is not limited
- 4 to the modernization, miniaturization, integration, and computerization
- 5 of electronic, hydraulic, pneumatic, laser, mechanical, robotics,
- 6 nuclear, chemical, telecommunication, and other technological
- 7 applications to enhance productivity in areas including but not limited
- 8 to manufacturing, communications, medicine, bioengineering, and
- 9 commerce."
- 10 "Sec. 3. RCW 28B.20.285 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 72 s 11 are each
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 A Washington ((high-technology)) technology center is created ((at
- 13 the University of Washington. The Washington high-technology center
- 14 shall provide: (1) An interdisciplinary program to support major high-
- 15 technology education and research initiatives within the state; (2) the
- 16 resources necessary for research and development programs in high
- 17 technology; (3) quality training for advanced undergraduate and
- 18 graduate students in high technology; and (4) interdisciplinary
- 19 approaches to instruction and research in high-technology fields.
- The Washington high-technology center shall be administered by the
- 21 board of regents with the advice of the high-technology coordinating
- 22 board. The University of Washington shall make the facilities of the
- 23 Washington high-technology center available to other institutions of
- 24 higher education when specific program needs so require)) to be a
- 25 <u>collaborative effort between the state's universities, private</u>
- 26 <u>industry</u>, and government. The technology center shall be headquartered
- 27 <u>at the University of Washington. The mission of the technology center</u>
- 28 shall be to perform and commercialize research on a state-wide basis
- 29 that benefits the intermediate and long-term economic vitality of the

- 1 state of Washington, and to develop and strengthen university-industry
- 2 relationships through the conduct of research that is primarily of
- 3 interest to Washington-based companies or state economic development
- 4 programs. The technology center shall:
- 5 (1) Perform and/or facilitate research supportive of state science
- 6 and technology objectives, particularly as they relate to state
- 7 industries;
- 8 (2) Provide leading edge collaborative research and technology
- 9 <u>transfer opportunities primarily to state industries;</u>
- 10 (3) Provide substantial opportunities for training undergraduate
- 11 and graduate students through direct involvement in research and
- 12 <u>industry interactions;</u>
- 13 (4) Emphasize and develop nonstate support of the technology
- 14 <u>center's research activities; and</u>
- 15 (5) Provide a forum for effective interaction between the state's
- 16 <u>technology-based industries and its academic research institutions</u>
- 17 through promotion of faculty collaboration with industry, particularly
- 18 within the state."
- 19 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) The technology center shall be
- 20 administered by the board of directors of the technology center.
- 21 (2) The board shall consist of the following members: Fourteen
- 22 members from among individuals who are associated with or employed by
- 23 technology-based industries and have broad business experience and an
- 24 understanding of high technology; eight members from the state's
- 25 universities with graduate science and engineering programs; the
- 26 executive director of the Spokane Intercollegiate Research and
- 27 Technology Institute or his or her designated representative; the
- 28 provost of the University of Washington or his or her designated
- 29 representative; the provost of the Washington State University or his

- 1 or her designated representative; and the director of the state
- 2 department of trade and economic development or his or her designated
- 3 representative. The term of office for each board member, excluding
- 4 the executive director of the Spokane Intercollegiate Research and
- 5 Technology Institute, the provost of the University of Washington, the
- 6 provost of the Washington State University, and the director of the
- 7 state department of trade and economic development, shall be three
- 8 years. The executive director of the technology center shall be an ex
- 9 officio, nonvoting member of the board. The board shall meet at least
- 10 quarterly. Board members shall be appointed by the governor based on
- 11 the recommendations of the existing board of the technology center, and
- 12 the research universities. The governor shall stagger the terms of the
- 13 first group of appointees to ensure the long term continuity of the
- 14 board.
- 15 (3) The duties of the board include:
- 16 (a) Developing the general operating policies for the technology
- 17 center;
- (b) Appointing the executive director of the technology center;
- 19 (c) Approving the annual operating budget of the technology center;
- 20 (d) Establishing priorities for the selection and funding of
- 21 research projects that guarantee the greatest potential return on the
- 22 state's investment;
- 23 (e) Approving and allocating funding for research projects
- 24 conducted by the technology center, based on the recommendations of the
- 25 advisory committees for each of the research centers;
- 26 (f) In cooperation with the department of trade and economic
- 27 development, developing a biennial work plan and five-year strategic
- 28 plan for the technology center that are consistent with the state-wide
- 29 technology development and commercialization goals;

- 1 (g) Coordinating with the University of Washington, Washington
- 2 State University, and other participating institutions of higher
- 3 education in the development of training, research, and development
- 4 programs to be conducted at the technology center that shall be
- 5 targeted to meet industrial needs;
- 6 (h) Assisting the department of trade and economic development in
- 7 the department's efforts to develop state science and technology public
- 8 policies and coordinate publicly funded programs;
- 9 (i) Reviewing annual progress reports on funded research projects
- 10 that are prepared by the advisory committees for each of the research
- 11 centers;
- 12 (j) Providing an annual report to the governor and the legislature
- 13 detailing the activities and performance of the technology center; and
- 14 (k) Submitting annually to the department of trade and economic
- 15 development an updated strategic plan and a statement of performance
- 16 measured against the mission, roles, and contractual obligations of the
- 17 technology center."
- 18 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The University of Washington, Washington
- 19 State University, and other participating institutions of higher
- 20 education shall provide the affiliated staff, faculty, and facilities
- 21 required to support the operation of the technology center."
- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. The department of trade and economic
- 23 development shall contract with the University of Washington for the
- 24 expenditure of state-appropriated funds for the operation of the
- 25 Washington technology center. The department of trade and economic
- 26 development shall provide guidance to the technology center regarding
- 27 expenditure of state-appropriated funds and the development of the
- 28 center's strategic plan. The director of the department of trade and

- 1 economic development shall not withhold funds appropriated for the
- 2 technology center if the technology center complies with the provisions
- 3 of its contract with the department of trade and economic development.
- 4 The department shall be responsible to the legislature for the
- 5 contractual performance of the center."
- 6 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. The facilities of the technology center
- 7 shall be made available to other institutions of higher education
- 8 within the state when this would benefit specific program needs."
- 9 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. Sections 1, 2, and 4 through 7 of this
- 10 act are each added to chapter 28B.20 RCW."
