- 5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the

- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. This act shall be known as the higher
- 8 education opportunity act of 1991."
- 9 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The state of Washington has historically
- 10 given high priority to the higher education needs of its citizens. As
- 11 we move to the twenty-first century and to the more competitive world
- 12 economy that it brings, it is imperative that we provide access to all
- 13 of the types of higher education that are needed by the citizens of
- 14 Washington, including access to the community college system, one of
- 15 the finest community college systems in the country.
- 16 The higher education coordinating board has determined that there
- 17 is a need in this state for increased participation at the upper-
- 18 division and graduate levels and that baccalaureate and graduate
- 19 degrees need to be earned at an increased rate for our citizens to
- 20 maintain competitiveness in the world economy. There is also a need to
- 21 increase the opportunity for citizens to learn entry-level skills and
- 22 trades resulting in their ability to become productive individuals in
- 23 our society and not depend on the state for subsistence grants.
- 24 It is the intent of the legislature to endorse the long-term
- 25 enrollment goals established by the higher education coordinating
- 26 board. This act begins the process of achieving the board's goals of
- 27 a participation rate equal to the 70th percentile of national

- 1 participation rates for upper-division and graduate students and a
- 2 participation rate equal to the 90th percentile of national
- 3 participation rates for all students.
- 4 It is the intent of this act to begin the process of providing a
- 5 place in the higher education system for all citizens of Washington who
- 6 are qualified for and desirous of earning a college degree, and to
- 7 assure that the quality of those degrees are not jeopardized by
- 8 inadequate funding levels.
- 9 It is the further intent of this act to modify the present
- 10 enrollment lids which limit the size of the student population on the
- 11 public higher education campuses in the state. This act will be the
- 12 first step toward meeting the educational needs of our citizens in the
- 13 1990's. The legislature finds that the present enrollment lids at the
- 14 public institutions are artificially set and that an increase in the
- 15 number of full-time equivalent enrollments on the campuses can be
- 16 accomplished without additional capital construction. The legislature
- 17 further finds that at many of our state institutions of higher
- 18 education there is the physical capacity available to accept new
- 19 students, and there is also a desire among the institutions to accept
- 20 new enrollments in the coming biennium. It is the intent of this act
- 21 to remain sensitive to the capability and capacity of each institution
- 22 to accept additional enrollments.
- It is not the intent of this act to emphasize access to the
- 24 detriment of quality in the educational programs of our institutions.
- 25 Therefore, it is the intent of the legislature that this act be
- 26 approved during the fifty-second legislative session only if the
- 27 legislature fully restores the essential requirements funding level of
- 28 the state's colleges and universities in the 1991-93 biennial budget.
- 29 It is the further intent of the legislature that the funding formula
- 30 for new enrollments under this act are based on the 1990 higher

- 1 education coordinating board cost study and include both the direct and
- 2 indirect costs associated with additional student enrollments."
- 3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The new enrollments authorized in
- 4 sections 4 through 10 of this act are additional state-funded
- 5 enrollments at our state institutions of higher education above the
- 6 level established for each institution during the 1989-91 biennium:
- 7 PROVIDED, That should the level of funding for enrollment increases, in
- 8 the omnibus appropriations act or in Senate Bill No. 5814, be
- 9 insufficient to provide for the full level of enrollment increases set
- 10 forth in sections 4 through 10 of this act the enrollment increases set
- 11 forth in those sections shall be reduced proportionate to the actual
- 12 level of funding provided in either of the aforementioned acts."
- 13 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Subject to the provisions of section 3
- 14 of this act, the state-funded enrollment level at the University of
- 15 Washington shall be increased by three hundred twenty-eight full-time
- 16 equivalent students during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional
- 17 four hundred eighty-one full-time equivalent students during the 1992-
- 18 93 fiscal year. The new enrollments authorized in this section are
- 19 subject to the following distribution:
- 20 (1) The enrollment level at the Tacoma branch campus shall be
- 21 increased by one hundred seventeen full-time equivalent upper-division
- 22 and graduate enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an
- 23 additional one hundred ninety-nine full-time equivalent upper-division
- 24 and graduate enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year;
- 25 (2) The enrollment level at the Bothell/Woodinville branch campus
- 26 shall be increased by eighty-eight full-time equivalent upper-division
- 27 and graduate enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an

- 1 additional one hundred sixty-four full-time equivalent upper-division
- 2 and graduate enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year;
- 3 (3) The enrollment level in the evening program shall be increased
- 4 by forty full-time equivalent upper-division and graduate enrollments
- 5 during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional thirty-five full-
- 6 time equivalent upper-division and graduate enrollments during the
- 7 1992-93 fiscal year; and
- 8 (4) The enrollment level at the main campus shall be increased by
- 9 eighty-three full-time equivalent graduate enrollments during the 1991-
- 10 92 fiscal year, plus an additional eighty-three full-time equivalent
- 11 graduate enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year."
- 12 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Subject to the provisions of section 3
- 13 of this act, the state-funded enrollment level at Washington State
- 14 University shall be increased by two hundred fourteen full-time
- 15 equivalent students during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional
- 16 one hundred eighty full-time equivalent students during the 1992-93
- 17 fiscal year. The new enrollments authorized in this section are
- 18 subject to the following distribution:
- 19 (1) The enrollment level at the Pullman campus shall be increased
- 20 by forty-two full-time equivalent graduate enrollments during the 1991-
- 21 92 fiscal year, plus an additional forty-two full-time equivalent
- 22 graduate enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year;
- 23 (2) The enrollment level at the southwest Washington branch campus
- 24 shall be increased by eighty-nine full-time equivalent upper-division
- 25 and graduate enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an
- 26 additional seventy-eight full-time equivalent upper-division and
- 27 graduate enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year;
- 28 (3) The enrollment level at the Spokane branch campus shall be
- 29 increased by forty full-time equivalent upper-division and graduate

- 1 enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional twenty-
- 2 seven full-time equivalent upper-division and graduate enrollments
- 3 during the 1992-93 fiscal year;
- 4 (4) The enrollment level at the Tri-Cities branch campus shall be
- 5 increased by forty-three full-time equivalent upper-division and
- 6 graduate enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional
- 7 thirty-three full-time equivalent upper-division and graduate
- 8 enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year."
- 9 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Subject to the provisions of section 3
- 10 of this act, the state-funded enrollment level at Central Washington
- 11 University shall be increased by two hundred twenty-one full-time
- 12 equivalent upper-division and eleven full-time equivalent graduate
- 13 enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional one
- 14 hundred twenty-three full-time equivalent upper-division and six full-
- 15 time equivalent graduate enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year."
- 16 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. Subject to the provisions of section 3
- 17 of this act, the state-funded enrollment level at Eastern Washington
- 18 University shall be increased by one hundred fifty-five full-time
- 19 equivalent upper-division and twenty-four full-time equivalent graduate
- 20 enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional one
- 21 hundred forty-six full-time equivalent upper-division and twenty-three
- 22 full-time equivalent graduate enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal
- 23 year."
- 24 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. Subject to the provisions of section 3
- 25 of this act, the state-funded enrollment level at The Evergreen State
- 26 College shall be increased by thirty-eight full-time equivalent upper-
- 27 division and two full-time equivalent graduate enrollments during the

- 1 1991-92 fiscal year, plus an additional thirty-six full-time equivalent
- 2 upper-division and two full-time equivalent graduate enrollments during
- 3 the 1992-93 fiscal year."
- 4 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. Subject to the provisions of section 3
- 5 of this act, the state-funded enrollment level at Western Washington
- 6 University shall be increased by ninety-five full-time equivalent
- 7 upper-division and eighty full-time equivalent graduate enrollments
- 8 during the 1991-92 fiscal year plus an additional ninety-six full-time
- 9 equivalent upper-division and eighty full-time equivalent graduate
- 10 enrollments during the 1992-93 fiscal year."
- 11 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. Subject to the provisions of section 3
- 12 of this act, the state-funded enrollment in the state community college
- 13 system shall be increased by one thousand nine hundred full-time
- 14 equivalent enrollments during the 1991-92 fiscal year plus an
- 15 additional one thousand nine hundred full-time equivalent enrollments
- 16 during the 1992-93 fiscal year. These new enrollments shall be
- 17 distributed throughout the system by the state board for community
- 18 college education consistent with the state board's weighted prorated
- 19 distribution methodology."
- 20 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 11. This act is necessary for the immediate
- 21 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 22 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 23 effect July 1, 1991."
- 24 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 12. If specific funding for the purposes of
- 25 this act, referencing this act by bill number, is not provided by June

- 1 30, 1991, through the passage of Senate Bill No. 5814 or in the omnibus
- 2 appropriations act, this act shall be null and void."
- 3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 13. If the essential requirements funding
- 4 level as calculated by the office of financial management for the 1991-
- 5 93 biennium for each state university, regional university, state
- 6 college, and the community college system, is not fully funded by June
- 7 30, 1991, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act shall be null and
- 8 void."
- 9 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 14. If the full-time equivalent enrollments
- 10 provided in this act are not funded at least at the level established
- 11 for each institution and the community college system by the 1990
- 12 higher education coordinating board cost study, including both direct
- 13 and indirect costs, this act shall be null and void."
