- 8 "(2)(a) The board shall consist of nine voting members appointed by

- 10 representatives of business, three representatives of labor, and,
- 11 serving as ex officio members, the superintendent of public
- 12 instruction, the executive director of the state board for community
- 13 and technical colleges, and the commissioner of the employment security
- 14 department. The chair of the board shall be a nonvoting member
