- 11 legislature finds that scarce resources limit the state's ability to
- 12 meet the needs of all unserved developmentally disabled citizens. Due
- 13 to this limited resource availability, developmentally disabled high
- 14 school graduates and other adults are often placed on a waiting list

- 16 programs. Waiting lists cause developmentally disabled high school

- 1 The secretary shall establish a regional disabilities employment
- 2 function that shall provide services to promote and enhance effective
- 3 transition from educational or treatment programs to employment for
- 4 persons with developmental disabilities, as defined in RCW 71A.10.020.
- 5 The regional disabilities employment function shall also enhance the
- 6 use of alternative resources such as social security work incentives
- 7 and natural supports and promote competitive, integrated employment
- 8 opportunities in both the public and private sector.
- 9 The regional disabilities employment function shall: (1) Develop
- 10 a package of incentives, offered by application to interested local
- 11 school districts, that enhance the disabled student's transition from

- 14 development, and other measures necessary to promote flexible teaching

- 28 (1) The secretary shall appoint regional disabilities employment
- 29 advisory councils to provide oversight to regional disabilities

- 1 employment function contractors pursuant to section 2 of this act.
- 2 Advisory councils shall use a competitive applications process to
- 3 develop a list of potential regional disabilities employment function
- 4 contractors from existing community organizations such as individuals,
- 5 firms, nonprofit organizations, county authorities, or other programs
- 6 demonstrating proven expertise in supported employment and a
- 7 willingness to collaborate with county authorities, regional support
- 8 networks, schools, and other involved parties. Advisory councils shall

- 3 (1) The individual education plan for a student with development

- 5 services beginning not later than when the student reaches age sixteen.
- 6 The portion of the individual education plan regarding transition
- 7 services shall be reviewed annually. The plan for transition services
- 8 shall be developed in conjunction with a regional coordinator of
- 9 transitional services for developmentally disabled persons, if any. To
- 10 the extent consistent with an appropriate education for the student,
- 11 preference shall be given to providing transitional services in a
- 12 community setting, to the preferences of parents and guardians, and to
- 13 the student's occupational preferences and interests.

- 21 coordinated set of activities for a student, designed within an
- 22 outcome-oriented process, that promotes movement from school to
- 23 postschool activities, including postsecondary education, vocational
- 24 education and training, integrated employment including supported
- 25 employment, continuing and adult education, adult services, independent
- 26 living, or community participation.
- 27 (4) The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules as
- 28 needed to implement this section."
