- 9 represent and petition as follows:
- 10 WHEREAS, The nation's economic system, the trade deficit, our
- 11 national security, and American jobs are tied closely to adequate and
- 12 stable supplies of energy; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Half of the country's energy use today is oil; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Imports of foreign oil are now increasing past the fifty
- 15 percent level, while domestic production continues to decline; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Repeated events in the Middle East point up the United
- 17 States' vulnerability to, and the potential for, oil supply disruptions
- 18 due to the unstable nature of this volatile region; and
- 19 WHEREAS, There is an urgent national need to pursue all practicable
- 20 measures to offset use of imported oil; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Many practicable alternatives to foreign oil are
- 22 available, including more efficient use of all forms of energy, ethanol
- 23 and other alternative vehicle fuels, enhanced production of domestic
- 24 oil and natural gas, nuclear energy, the sun, the wind, and geothermal
- 25 energy, and environmentally better use of domestic coal; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The least cost, most available, and most environmentally
- 27 benign alternative is increased investment in energy efficiency; and

- 1 WHEREAS, A clear and well-articulated national energy policy can
- 2 give strong and unequivocal national direction toward a sound energy
- 3 future;
- 4 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that Congress
- 5 quickly enact a national energy strategy and implementing measures that
- 6 will most effectively lead to reduced dependence on foreign oil.
- 7 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 8 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 9 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 10 House of Representatives, and to each member of Congress from the State
- 11 of Washington."
