- 26 public institutions of higher education or consortia of institutions to
- 27 encourage cooperative programs designed to address specific system

- 1 problems. Grants shall not exceed a two-year period. Each institution
- 2 or consortia of institutions receiving the award shall contribute some
- 3 financial support, either by covering part of the costs for the program
- 4 during its implementation, or by assuming continuing support at the end

- 10 shall have the following powers and duties in administering the

- 12 (1) To adopt rules necessary to carry out the program;
- 13 (2) To establish one or more review committees to assist in the
- 14 evaluation of proposals for funding. The review committee shall
- 15 include individuals with significant experience in higher education in
- 16 areas relevant to one or more of the funding period priorities;
- 17 (3) To establish each biennium specific guidelines for submitting
- 18 grant proposals consistent with the overall goals of the program.
- 19 During the 1991-93 biennium the guidelines shall be consistent with the
- 20 following priorities: (a) Minority and diversity initiatives that
