- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. SHORT TITLE. This chapter shall be known
- 8 as the state wildlife and recreation lands management act."
- 9 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE. (1) The legislature
- 10 finds that:
- 11 (a) The state of Washington owns and maintains a wide variety of
- 12 fish and wildlife habitat, natural areas, parks, and other recreation
- 13 lands;
- 14 (b) The state of Washington is responsible for managing these lands
- 15 for the benefit of the citizens, wildlife, and other natural resources
- 16 of the state;
- 17 (c) The state of Washington has recently significantly enhanced its
- 18 efforts to acquire critical habitat, natural areas, parks, and other
- 19 recreation lands and to transfer suitable lands from school trust to
- 20 conservation and park purposes;
- 21 (d) Recent unprecedented population growth has greatly increased
- 22 the threat to the state's fish and wildlife habitat and the demands
- 23 placed on the lands under (a) of this subsection;
- 24 (e) The importance of this habitat and these lands to the state is
- 25 continuing to increase as more people depend on them to satisfy their
- 26 needs and more plant and animal species require state-owned lands for
- 27 their survival;

- 1 (f) By itself, public ownership cannot guarantee that resources
- 2 will be protected, or that appropriate recreational opportunities will
- 3 be provided;
- 4 (g) Only through ongoing, responsible management can fish and
- 5 wildlife habitat, sensitive ecosystems, and recreational values be
- 6 protected;
- 7 (h) The operation and maintenance funding for state-owned fish and
- 8 wildlife habitat, natural areas, parks, and other recreation lands has
- 9 not kept pace with increasing demands placed upon such lands;
- 10 (i) Many needed operation and maintenance projects have been
- 11 deferred due to insufficient funding, resulting in increased costs when
- 12 the projects are finally undertaken; and
- 13 (j) An increase in operation and maintenance funding is necessary
- 14 to bring state-owned lands and facilities up to acceptable standards
- 15 and to protect the state's investment in its fish and wildlife habitat,
- 16 natural areas, parks, and other recreation lands.
- 17 (2) Therefore, it is the policy of the state to provide adequate
- 18 and continuing funding for operation and maintenance needs of state-
- 19 owned fish and wildlife habitat, natural areas, parks, and other
- 20 recreation lands to protect the state's investment in such lands, and
- 21 it is the purpose of this chapter to create a mechanism for doing so."
- 22 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. DEFINITIONS. The definitions set forth in
- 23 this section apply throughout this chapter.
- 24 (1) "Basic stewardship" means the costs associated with holding and
- 25 protecting property to maintain the functions for which the property
- 26 was acquired. It includes, but is not limited to, costs associated
- 27 with statutorily required in-lieu property taxes, weed and pest
- 28 control, fire protection, fence maintenance, cultural and
- 29 archaeological site protection, basic research related to maintenance

- 1 of natural area preserves and natural resource conservation areas,
- 2 basic resource and environmental protection, and meeting applicable
- 3 legal requirements.
- 4 (2) "Improved or developed resources" means the costs associated
- 5 with the built or manipulated environment. It includes, but is not
- 6 limited to, costs associated with maintaining buildings, grounds,
- 7 roads, trails, water access sites, and utility systems. Also included
- 8 are improvements to habitat such as bank stabilization, range
- 9 rehabilitation, and food and water sources.
- 10 (3) "Human use management" means the costs associated with visitor
- 11 management, education, and protection.
- 12 (4) "Administration" means state agency costs necessary to support
- 13 subsections (1) through (3) of this section. It includes, but is not
- 14 limited to, budget and accounting, personnel support services,
- 15 volunteer programs, and training."
- 16 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. STATE WILDLIFE AND RECREATION LANDS
- 17 MANAGEMENT ACCOUNT. There is created the state wildlife and recreation
- 18 lands management account in the state treasury.
- 19 (1) Moneys accumulated under this chapter shall be used exclusively
- 20 for the purposes specified in this chapter. Those purposes are to
- 21 support operation and maintenance activities and costs associated with
- 22 owning and managing state fish and wildlife habitat, natural areas such
- 23 as natural area preserves and natural resource conservation areas,
- 24 parks, and other recreation lands and include:
- 25 (a) Basic stewardship;
- 26 (b) Improved or developed resources;
- 27 (c) Human use management; and
- 28 (d) Administration.

- 1 Land acquisition, facility development or replacement, major renovation
- 2 projects, improvement or rehabilitation projects normally funded
- 3 through the capital budget, and operation and maintenance of state fish
- 4 hatcheries are excluded.
- 5 (2) No expenditures may be made from this account without
- 6 legislative appropriation."
- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. ALLOCATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF MONEYS. (1)
- 8 Moneys appropriated for this chapter from the state wildlife and
- 9 recreation lands management account shall be expended in the following
- 10 manner:
- 11 (a) Not less than thirty percent for basic stewardship;
- 12 (b) Not less than twenty percent for improved or developed
- 13 resources;
- 14 (c) Not less than fifteen percent for human use management; and
- 15 (d) Not more than fifteen percent for administration.
- 16 (e) The remaining twenty to thirty-five percent shall be considered
- 17 unallocated.
- 18 (2) In the event that moneys appropriated for this chapter to the
- 19 state wildlife and recreation lands management account under the
- 20 initial allocation prove insufficient to meet basic stewardship needs,
- 21 the unallocated amount shall be used to fund basic stewardship needs.
- 22 (3) Each eligible agency is not required to meet this specific
- 23 percentage distribution. However, funding across agencies should meet
- 24 these percentages during each biennium.
- 25 (4) It is intended that moneys disbursed from this account not
- 26 replace existing operation and maintenance funding levels from other
- 27 state sources.

- 1 (5) Agencies eligible to receive funds from this account are the
- 2 departments of fisheries, natural resources, and wildlife, and the
- 3 state parks and recreation commission.
- 4 (6) Moneys appropriated for this chapter from the state wildlife
- 5 and recreation lands management account shall be distributed in the
- 6 following manner:
- 7 (a) Not less than twenty-five percent to the state parks and
- 8 recreation commission.
- 9 (b) Not less than twenty-five percent to the department of natural
- 10 resources.
- 11 (c) Not less than twenty-five percent to the department of
- 12 wildlife.
- 13 (d) The remaining funds shall be allocated to eligible agencies
- 14 based upon an evaluation of remaining unfunded needs.
- 15 (7) The office of financial management shall review eligible state
- 16 agency requests and make recommendations on the allocation of funds
- 17 provided under this chapter as part of the governor's operating budget
- 18 request to the legislature."
- 19 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. STATE WILDLIFE AND RECREATION LANDS
- 20 MANAGEMENT TASK FORCE. (1) A state wildlife and recreation lands
- 21 management task force is hereby created to develop recommendations
- 22 regarding a new long-term funding source or sources to meet the
- 23 requirements of this chapter. The task force shall investigate
- 24 possible opportunities for the use of future appropriations for habitat
- 25 conservation and outdoor recreation lands under chapter 43.98A RCW in
- 26 meeting major operations and maintenance funding needs. The task force
- 27 shall also report on funding needed to assist counties with the
- 28 required police, fire protection, and other local services provided to

- 1 protect state-owned fish and wildlife habitat, natural areas, parks,
- 2 and other recreation lands.
- 3 (2)(a) The task force shall be composed of seven voting members,
- 4 appointed by the governor, representing different regions of the state.
- 5 (b) The task force shall include as ex officio, nonvoting members,
- 6 one member from each of the departments of fisheries, wildlife, and
- 7 natural resources, the state parks and recreation commission, and the
- 8 office of financial management appointed by the respective directors.
- 9 The president of the senate and the speaker of the house of
- 10 representatives shall each appoint one nonvoting member from each
- 11 caucus of their respective legislative bodies.
- 12 (3) The chair of the task force shall be a citizen member and shall
- 13 be chosen by the governor.
- 14 (4) The task force appointments shall be made by May 15, 1992.
- 15 (5) The task force shall provide for public involvement in the
- 16 development of the recommendations.
- 17 (6) The interagency committee for outdoor recreation and the office
- 18 of financial management shall provide staff support and technical
- 19 assistance to the task force. All participant agencies and the
- 20 department of revenue shall cooperate in the development of the
- 21 recommendations and shall provide relevant information as needed.
- 22 (7) A report and recommendations shall be submitted to the governor
- 23 and standing committees of the legislature by September 15, 1992."
- 24 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act
- 25 or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 26 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 27 persons or circumstances is not affected."

- 1 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. CAPTIONS NOT LAW. Section headings as used
- 2 in this act do not constitute any part of the law."
- 3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. Sections 1 through 5 and 7 of this act
- 4 shall constitute a new chapter in Title 43 RCW."
