- 11 native to Washington or have not been established in the state by
- 12 <u>wildlife agencies</u>.
- 13 "Director" means the director of agriculture of the state of
- 14 Washington or his authorized representative.
- 15 "Department" means the department of agriculture of the state of
- 16 Washington.
- 17 "Garbage" means the solid animal and vegetable waste and offal
- 18 together with the natural moisture content resulting from the handling,
- 19 preparation, or consumption of foods in houses, restaurants, hotels,
- 20 kitchens, markets, meat shops, packing houses and similar
- 21 establishments or any other food waste containing meat or meat
- 22 products.
- 23 "Veterinary biologic" means any virus, serum, toxin, and analogous
- 24 product of natural or synthetic origin, or product prepared from any
- 25 type of genetic engineering, such as diagnostics, antitoxins, vaccines,
- 26 live microorganisms, killed microorganisms, and the antigenic or
- 27 immunizing components intended for use in the diagnosis, treatment, or
- 28 prevention of diseases in animals.

- 1 "Domestic animal" means any animal that is a farm animal or
- 2 <u>companion animal or both.</u>
- 3 <u>"Farm animal" means any domestic species of cattle, sheep, swine, </u>
- 4 goats, llamas, poultry, or horses that are normally and have
- 5 historically been kept and raised on farms in the United States and
- 6 <u>used or intended for use as food, fiber, or breeding. This term also</u>
- 7 includes animals such as rabbits, mink, and chinchilla if they are used
- 8 solely for the purposes of meat or fur, and animals such as horses and
- 9 <u>llamas if used solely as work and pack animals.</u>
- 10 "Companion animal" means, but is not limited to, any animal such as
- 11 dogs, cats, nonhuman primates, guinea pigs, hamsters, rabbits, ferrets,
- 12 birds, llamas, pigs, or horses historically or recently associated with
- 13 humans as pets, security, disability assistance, or for breeding,
- 14 hunting, racing, riding, or other recreation."
- 15 "Sec. 2. RCW 16.36.010 and 1927 c 165 s 2 are each amended to read
- 16 as follows:
- 17 The word "quarantine" as used in this act shall mean the placing
- 18 and restraining of any animal or animals by the owner or agents in
- 19 charge thereof, either within a certain described and designated
- 20 enclosure or area within this state, or the restraining of any such
- 21 animal or animals from entering this state, as may be directed in
- 22 writing by the director of agriculture, or his or her duly authorized
- 23 representative. Any animal or animals so quarantined within the state
- 24 shall at all times be kept separate and apart from other ((domestic))
- 25 animals and not allowed to have anything in common therewith."
- 26 "Sec. 3. RCW 16.36.020 and 1987 c 163 s 2 are each amended to read
- 27 as follows:

- 1 The director shall have general supervision of the prevention of
- 2 the spread and the suppression of infectious, contagious, communicable
- 3 and dangerous diseases affecting animals within, in transit through and
- 4 being imported into the state. The director may establish and enforce
- 5 quarantine of and against any and all domestic animals, exotic wild
- 6 <u>animals</u>, or wildlife raised in captivity which are affected with any
- 7 such disease or that may have been exposed to others thus affected,
- 8 whether within or without the state, for such length of time as he or
- 9 she deems necessary to determine whether any such animal is infected
- 10 with any such disease. The director shall also enforce and administer
- 11 the provisions of this chapter pertaining to garbage feeding and when
- 12 garbage has been fed to swine, the director may require the
- 13 disinfection of all facilities, including yard, transportation and

- of veterinary inspection, or official written animal health instrument 1 of the department of agriculture. It shall be unlawful for any person, 2 3 or any railroad or transportation company, or other common carrier, to 4 bring into this state for any purpose any domestic animals, exotic wild 5 animals, or native wildlife raised in captivity without first having 6 secured an official health certificate or certificate of veterinary inspection, certified by the state veterinarian of origin that such 7 animals meet the health requirements ((promulgated)) adopted by the 8 director of agriculture of the state of Washington: PROVIDED, That 9 10 this section shall not apply to domestic animals imported into this state for immediate slaughter, or domestic animals imported for the 11 purpose of unloading for feed, rest, and water, for a period not in 12 13 excess of twenty-eight hours except upon prior permit therefor secured from the director of agriculture. It shall be unlawful for any person 14 to divert en route for other than to an approved, inspected stockyard 15 for immediate slaughter or to sell for other than immediate slaughter 16 17 or to fail to slaughter within fourteen days after arrival, any animal 18 imported into this state for immediate slaughter. It shall be unlawful 19 for any person, railroad, transportation company, or other common 20 carrier, to keep any domestic animals which are unloaded for feed, rest and water in other than quarantined pens, or not to report any missing 21 animals to the director of agriculture at the time the animals are 22 23 reloaded."
- 24 "Sec. 5. RCW 16.36.040 and 1979 c 154 s 10 are each amended to 25 read as follows:
- The director of agriculture shall have power to ((promulgate))
- 27 <u>adopt</u> and enforce such reasonable rules((<del>, regulations</del>)) and orders as
- 28 he or she may deem necessary or proper to prevent the introduction or
- 29 spreading of infectious, contagious, communicable, or dangerous

diseases affecting domestic animals, exotic wild animals, or native 1 2 wildlife raised in captivity in this state, and to ((promulgate)) adopt 3 and enforce such reasonable rules((<del>, regulations</del>)) and orders as he <u>or</u> 4 she may deem necessary or proper governing the inspection and test of all animals within or about to be imported into this state, and to 5 6 ((promulgate)) adopt and enforce intercounty embargoes and quarantine to prevent the shipment, trailing, trucking, transporting, or movement 7 of bovine animals from any county that has not been declared modified 8 9 accredited by the United States department of agriculture, animal and 10 plant health inspection service, for tuberculosis and/or certified brucellosis-free, into a county ((which)) that has been declared 11 12 modified accredited by the United States department of agriculture, animal and plant health inspection service, for tuberculosis and/or 13 14 certified brucellosis-free, unless such animals are accompanied by a negative certificate of tuberculin test made within sixty days and/or 15 a negative brucellosis test made within the forty-five day period prior 16 17 to the movement of such animal into such county, issued by a duly authorized veterinary inspector of the state department of agriculture, 18 19 or of the United States department of agriculture, animal and plant 20 health inspection service, or an accredited veterinarian authorized by permit issued by the director of agriculture to execute such 21 certificate." 22

23 "Sec. 6. RCW 16.36.060 and 1985 c 415 s 2 are each amended to read 24 as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully hinder, obstruct, or resist the director of agriculture or any duly authorized representative, or any peace officer acting under him or her or them, when engaged in the performance of the duties or in the exercise of the powers conferred by this chapter, and it shall be unlawful for any

- person to willfully fail to comply with or violate any rule((-1 2 regulation)) or order ((promulgated)) adopted by the director of agriculture or his or her duly authorized representatives under the 3 4 provisions of this chapter. The director of agriculture shall have the authority under such rules ((and regulations)) 5 as 6 ((promulgated)) adopted by ((him)) the director to enter at any reasonable time the premises of any ((livestock)) domestic animals, 7 exotic wild animals, or native wildlife raised in captivity owner to 8 9 make tests on any animals for diseased conditions, and it shall be 10 unlawful for any person to interfere with such tests in any manner, or to violate any segregation or identification order made in connection 11 with such tests by the director of agriculture, or his or her duly 12 13 authorized representative."

16 Whenever a majority of any board of health, board of county commissioners, city council or other governing body of any incorporated 17 18 city or town, or trustees of any township, whether in session or not, 19 shall, in writing or by telegraph, notify the director of agriculture of the prevalence of or probable danger of infection from any of the 20 diseases of domestic animals, exotic wild animals, or native wildlife 21 raised in captivity the director of agriculture personally, or by the 22 23 supervisor of dairy and livestock, or by a duly appointed and deputized 24 veterinarian of the division of dairy and livestock, shall at once go 25 to the place designated in said notice and take such action as the exigencies may in his or her judgment demand, and may in case of an 26 27 emergency appoint deputies or assistants, with equal power to act. The 28 compensation to be paid such emergency deputies and assistants, shall be fixed by the director of agriculture in conformity with the 29

- 8 discovery of the existence or suspected existence among domestic
- 9 animals, exotic wild animals, or native wildlife raised in captivity
- 10 within the state of any reportable diseases as published by the
