- 7 "Sec. 1. RCW 72.23.025 and 1989 c 205 s 21 are each amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (1) It is the intent of the legislature to improve the quality of
- 10 service at state hospitals, eliminate overcrowding, and more
- 11 specifically define the role of the state hospitals. The legislature
- 12 intends that eastern and western state hospitals shall become clinical
- 13 centers for handling the most complicated long-term care needs of
- 14 patients with a primary diagnosis of mental disorder. Over the next
- 15 six years, their involvement in providing short-term ((and)), acute
- 16 care, and less complicated long-term care shall be diminished in
- 17 accordance with the revised responsibilities for mental health care
- 18 under chapter 71.24 RCW. To this end, the legislature intends that
- 19 funds appropriated for mental health programs, including funds for
- 20 regional support networks and the state hospitals be used for persons
- 21 with primary diagnosis of mental disorder. To the extent that persons
- 22 with developmental disabilities, head injury, AIDS, or substance abuse
- 23 are treated by state hospitals, the legislature intends that the
- 24 <u>secretary allocate funds from separate appropriations to help support</u>
- 25 their care. The legislature finds that establishment of the eastern
- 26 state hospital board, the western state hospital board, and institutes
- 27 for the study and treatment of mental disorders at both eastern state

- 1 hospital and western state hospital will be instrumental in
- 2 implementing the legislative intent.
- 3 (2)(a) The eastern state hospital board and the western state
- 4 hospital board are each established. Members of the boards shall be
- 5 appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate. Each board
- 6 shall include:
- 7 (i) The director of the institute for the study and treatment of
- 8 mental disorders established at the hospital;
- 9 (ii) One family member of a current or recent hospital resident;
- 10 (iii) One consumer of services;
- 11 (iv) One community mental health service provider;
- 12 (v) Two citizens with no financial or professional interest in
- 13 mental health services;
- 14 (vi) One representative of the regional support network in which
- 15 the hospital is located;
- 16 (vii) One representative from the staff who is a physician;
- 17 (viii) One representative from the nursing staff;
- 18 (ix) One representative from the other professional staff;
- 19 (x) One representative from the nonprofessional staff; and
- 20 (xi) One representative of a minority community.
- 21 (b) At least one representative listed in (a) (viii), (ix), or (x)
- 22 of this subsection shall be a union member.
- 23 (c) Members shall serve four-year terms. Members of the board
- 24 shall be reimbursed for travel expenses as provided in RCW 43.03.050
- 25 and 43.03.060 and shall receive compensation as provided in RCW
- 26 43.03.240.
- 27 (3) The boards established under this section shall:
- 28 (a) Monitor the operation and activities of the hospital;
- 29 (b) Review and advise on the hospital budget;

- 1 (c) Make recommendations to the governor and the legislature for
- 2 improving the quality of service provided by the hospital;
- 3 (d) Monitor and review the activities of the hospital in
- 4 implementing the intent of the legislature set forth in this section;
- 5 (e) Report periodically to the governor and the legislature on the
- 6 implementation of the legislative intent set forth in this section; and
- 7 (f) Consult with the secretary regarding persons the secretary may
- 8 select as the superintendent of the hospital whenever a vacancy occurs.
- 9 (4)(a) There is established at eastern state hospital and western
- 10 state hospital, institutes for the study and treatment of mental
- 11 disorders. The institutes shall be operated by joint operating
- 12 agreements between state colleges and universities and the department
- 13 of social and health services. The institutes are intended to conduct
- 14 training, research, and clinical program development activities that
- 15 will directly benefit mentally ill persons receiving treatment in
- 16 Washington state by performing the following activities:
- 17 (i) Promote recruitment and retention of highly qualified
- 18 professionals at the state hospitals and community mental health
- 19 programs;
- 20 (ii) Improve clinical care by exploring new, innovative, and
- 21 scientifically based treatment models for persons presenting
- 22 particularly difficult and complicated clinical syndromes;
- 23 (iii) Provide expanded training opportunities for existing staff at
- 24 the state hospitals and community mental health programs;
- 25 (iv) Promote bilateral understanding of treatment orientation,
- 26 possibilities, and challenges between state hospital professionals and
- 27 community mental health professionals.
- 28 (b) To accomplish these purposes the institutes may, within funds
- 29 appropriated for this purpose:

- 1 (i) Enter joint operating agreements with state universities or
- 2 other institutions of higher education to accomplish the placement and
- 3 training of students and faculty in psychiatry, psychology, social
- 4 work, occupational therapy, nursing, and other relevant professions at
- 5 the state hospitals and community mental health programs;
- 6 (ii) Design and implement clinical research projects to improve the
- 7 quality and effectiveness of state hospital services and operations;
- 8 (iii) Enter into agreements with community mental health service
- 9 providers to accomplish the exchange of professional staff between the
- 10 state hospitals and community mental health service providers;
- 11 (iv) Establish a student loan forgiveness and conditional
- 12 scholarship program to retain qualified professionals at the state
- 13 hospitals and community mental health providers when the
- 14 ((superintendent)) secretary has determined a shortage of such
- 15 professionals exists.
- 16 (c) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary,
- 17 the institutes may enter into agreements with the department or the
- 18 state hospitals which may involve changes in staffing necessary to
- 19 implement improved patient care programs contemplated by this section.
- 20 (d) The institutes are authorized to seek and accept public or
- 21 private gifts, grants, contracts, or donations to accomplish their
- 22 purposes under this section.
- 23 (5) The department shall review the diagnoses and treatment history
- 24 of hospital patients and create a plan to locate inappropriately placed
- 25 persons into medicaid reimbursable nursing homes or other nonhospital
- 26 settings. The plan shall be submitted to the legislature by June 30,
- 27 1990."
- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 72.23 RCW
- 29 to read as follows:

- 1 The secretary shall from funds appropriated for appropriate
- 2 nonmental health program budgets within the department develop a system
- 3 of payments or other incentives to discourage the inappropriate
- 4 placement of the developmentally disabled, those with head injury,
- 5 AIDS, those suffering the effects of substance abuse, or those with
- 6 similar ailments at the state hospitals, whether or not a mental
- 7 disorder is associated with their illness, and to encourage their care
- 8 in community settings or on state hospital or residential habilitation
- 9 center grounds. The system shall be similar to that used in contracts
- 10 with regional support networks to limit their use of the state
- 11 hospitals.
- 12 Under the system, state, local, or community agencies shall be
- 13 given financial or other incentives to develop appropriate crisis
- 14 intervention and community care arrangements. However, if it is
- 15 determined that care on state hospital grounds is appropriate, the
- 16 secretary shall condition such care on payments from appropriate
- 17 nonmental health program budgets within the department. The payments
- 18 shall be adequate to support additional care that the superintendents
- 19 may determine are needed for these persons, after consultation with
- 20 experts and the boards.
- The secretary may establish specialized care programs for persons
- 22 described in this section on the grounds of the state hospitals. Such
- 23 programs may operate according to professional standards that do not
- 24 conform to existing federal or private hospital accreditation
- 25 standards."
- 26 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate
- 27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 28 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 29 effect immediately."
