**Background:** The minimum number of district court judges in each county is set by statute. Periodically, these numbers are adjusted to reflect shifts in population and caseloads.

**Summary of Bill:** The minimum numbers of district court judges in three counties are increased as follows:

- o King County from 24 to 26;
- o Pierce County from 8 to 11; and
- o Spokane County from 8 to 9.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.

**Effective Date:** Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** The workload for the district courts in these counties justifies the additional judges.

**Testimony Against:** None.
