#### **BACKGROUND:**

Appropriation authority is required for the expenditure of state funds. State government operates on the basis of a fiscal biennium that begins on July 1 of each odd-numbered year. A biennial budget was enacted during the 1991 legislative session.

### **SUMMARY:**

The 1991-93 transportation agencies appropriation act is amended.

The increase in appropriation authority over the current biennium is \$113 million, of which \$15 million is from the motor vehicle fund-state revenues.

## SUMMARY OF PROPOSED SENATE AMENDMENT:

A \$145 million budget appropriation is made for transportation agencies of which \$90 million is from the motor vehicle fund-federal. The \$33 million appropriation for the Washington State Patrol headquarters facility is eliminated and

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additional federal funds from ISTEA are appropriated. Spread sheets are available.
