- 1 AN ACT Relating to the state employees' benefits board; and
- 2 amending RCW 41.05.055 and 41.05.065.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 41.05.055 and 1989 c 324 s 1 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The state employees' benefits board is created within the
- 7 authority. The function of the board is to design and approve
- 8 insurance benefit plans for state employees.
- 9 (2) The board shall be composed of ((seven)) eight members
- 10 appointed by the governor as follows:
- 11 (a) ((Three)) Four representatives of state employees, one of whom
- 12 shall represent an employee association certified as exclusive
- 13 representative of at least one bargaining unit of classified employees,
- 14 ((one)) two of whom shall represent ((an employee union certified as

- 1 exclusive representative of at least one bargaining unit of classified
- 2 employees,)) at least two employee unions certified as exclusive
- 3 representatives of bargaining units of classified employees and one of
- 4 whom is retired, is covered by a program under the jurisdiction of the
- 5 board, and represents an organized group of retired public employees;
- 6 (b) Three members with experience in health benefit management and
- 7 cost containment; and
- 8 (c) The administrator.
- 9 (3) The governor shall appoint the initial members of the board to
- 10 staggered terms not to exceed four years. Members appointed thereafter
- 11 shall serve two-year terms. Members of the board shall be compensated
- 12 in accordance with RCW 43.03.250 and shall be reimbursed for their
- 13 travel expenses while on official business in accordance with RCW
- 14 43.03.050 and 43.03.060. The board shall prescribe rules for the
- 15 conduct of its business. The administrator shall serve as chair of the
- 16 board. Meetings of the board shall be at the call of the chair.
- 17 **Sec. 2.** RCW 41.05.065 and 1988 c 107 s 8 are each amended to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 (1) The board shall study all matters connected with the provision
- 20 of health care coverage, life insurance, liability insurance,
- 21 accidental death and dismemberment insurance, and disability income
- 22 insurance or any of, or a combination of, the enumerated types of
- 23 insurance for employees and their dependents on the best basis possible
- 24 with relation both to the welfare of the employees and to the state:
- 25 PROVIDED, That liability insurance shall not be made available to
- 26 dependents.
- 27 (2) The state employees' benefits board shall develop employee
- 28 benefit plans that include comprehensive health care benefits for all

- 1 employees. In developing these plans, the board shall consider the
- 2 following elements:
- 3 (a) Methods of maximizing cost containment while ensuring access to
- 4 quality health care;
- 5 (b) Development of provider arrangements that encourage cost
- 6 containment and ensure access to quality care, including but not
- 7 limited to prepaid delivery systems and prospective payment methods;
- 8 (c) Wellness incentives that focus on proven strategies, such as
- 9 smoking cessation, exercise, and automobile and motorcycle safety;
- 10 (d) Utilization review procedures including, but not limited to
- 11 prior authorization of services, hospital inpatient length of stay
- 12 review, requirements for use of outpatient surgeries and second
- 13 opinions for surgeries, review of invoices or claims submitted by
- 14 service providers, and performance audit of providers; and
- 15 (e) Effective coordination of benefits.
- 16 (3) The board shall design benefits and determine the terms and
- 17 conditions of employee participation and coverage, including
- 18 establishment of eligibility criteria.
- 19 (4) The board may authorize premium contributions for an employee
- 20 and the employee's dependents. Such authorization shall require a vote
- 21 of ((five)) six members of the board for approval.
- 22 (5) Employees may choose participation in only one of the health
- 23 care benefit plans developed by the board.
- 24 (6) The board shall review plans proposed by insurance carriers
- 25 that desire to offer property insurance and/or accident and casualty
- 26 insurance to state employees through payroll deduction. The board may
- 27 approve any such plan for payroll deduction by carriers holding a valid
- 28 certificate of authority in the state of Washington and which the board
- 29 determines to be in the best interests of employees and the state. The
- 30 board shall promulgate rules setting forth criteria by which it shall

1 evaluate the plans.
