- 1 AN ACT Relating to natural resources conservation areas; amending
- 2 RCW 79.71.010, 79.71.020, 79.71.030, 79.71.050, 79.71.060, 79.71.070,
- 3 79.71.080, and 79.71.090; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 79.71.010 and 1987 c 472 s 1 are each amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 The legislature finds that: (1) ((That)) There is an increasing
- 8 and continuing need by the people of Washington for certain areas of
- 9 the state to be conserved, in rural as well as urban settings, for the
- 10 benefit of present and future generations; (2) ((that)) such areas are
- 11 worthy of conservation for their outstanding scenic and ecological
- 12 values and provide opportunities for ((dispersed)) low impact public
- 13 ((recreation)) use; (3) ((that)) in certain cases acquisition of
- 14 property or rights in property is necessary to protect these areas for
- 15 public purposes; and (4) ( $(\frac{\text{that}}{})$ ) there is a need for  $((\frac{\text{an}}{}))$  a state

- 1 agency to act in an effective and timely manner to acquire interests in
- 2 such areas and to develop appropriate management strategies for
- 3 conservation purposes.
- 4 Sec. 2. RCW 79.71.020 and 1987 c 472 s 2 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 Lands possessing the following characteristics are considered by
- 7 the legislature to be worthy of consideration for conservation
- 8 purposes:
- 9 (1) Lands identified as having high priority for conservation,
- 10 natural systems, wildlife, and ((dispersed recreational)) low-impact
- 11 <u>public use</u> values;
- 12 (2) ((Prime natural features of the Washington landscape or
- 13 portions thereof, inland or coastal wetlands, significant littoral,
- 14 estuarine, or aquatic sites, or important geological features)) An area
- 15 of land or water, or land and water, that has flora, fauna, geological,
- 16 <u>archaeological</u>, <u>scenic</u>, <u>or similar features of critical importance to</u>
- 17 the people of Washington and that has retained to some degree or has
- 18 reestablished its natural character;
- 19 (3) Examples of native ecological communities; and
- 20 (4) Environmentally significant sites threatened with conversion to
- 21 incompatible or ecologically irreversible uses.
- 22 **Sec. 3.** RCW 79.71.030 and 1987 c 472 s 3 are each amended to read
- 23 as follows:
- 24 As used in this chapter:
- 25 "Commissioner" means the commissioner of public lands.
- 26 "Department" means the department of natural resources.
- 27 "Conservation purposes" include but are not limited to: (1)
- 28 Maintaining, enhancing, or restoring ecological systems, including but

- 1 not limited to aquatic, coastal, riparian, montane, and geological
- 2 systems, whether such systems be unique or typical to the state of
- 3 Washington; (2) maintaining exceptional scenic landscapes; (3)
- 4 maintaining habitat for threatened, endangered, and sensitive species;
- 5 (4) enhancing sites for primitive recreational purposes; and (5)
- 6 outdoor environmental education.
- 7 <u>"Low-impact public use" includes public recreation uses and</u>
- 8 improvements that do not adversely affect the resource values, are
- 9 appropriate to the maintenance of the site in a relatively unmodified
- 10 natural setting, and do not detract from long-term ecological
- 11 processes.
- 12 "Management ((for conservation purposes)) activities may include
- 13 limited production of income from forestry, agriculture, or other
- 14 resource management activities, if such actions are consistent with the
- 15 other purposes and requirements of this chapter.
- 16 (("Washington natural resources conservation area" is an area of
- 17 land and/or water which retains to some degree or has reestablished its
- 18 natural character, although it need not be completely undisturbed, or
- 19 has flora, fauna, geological, archaeological, scenic, or similar
- 20 features of critical importance to the people of Washington.))
- 21 "Natural resources conservation area" or "conservation area" means
- 22 an area having the characteristics identified in RCW 79.71.020.
- 23 **Sec. 4.** RCW 79.71.050 and 1987 c 472 s 5 are each amended to read
- 24 as follows:
- 25 The department is authorized to transfer fee simple interest or
- 26 less than fee interests in trust land, as defined by Article XVI of the
- 27 Washington Constitution, for the creation of <u>natural resources</u>
- 28 conservation ((management)) areas, ((providing there is)) provided the
- 29 <u>owner of the trust land receives</u> full fair market value compensation

- 1 for all rights transferred. The proceeds from such transfers shall be
- 2 used for the exclusive purpose of acquiring real property to replace
- 3 those interests utilized for the conservation area in order to meet the
- 4 department's fiduciary obligations and to maintain the productive land
- 5 base of the various trusts.
- 6 **Sec. 5.** RCW 79.71.060 and 1987 c 472 s 6 are each amended to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 The department shall hold a public hearing in the county where the
- 9 majority of the land in the proposed <u>natural resources</u> conservation
- 10 area is located prior to establishing the boundary. An area proposed
- 11 for designation must contain resources consistent with ((the purposes
- 12 of this chapter)) characteristics identified in RCW 79.71.020.
- 13 Sec. 6. RCW 79.71.070 and 1987 c 472 s 7 are each amended to read
- 14 as follows:
- 15 The department shall develop a management plan for each designated
- 16 area. The plan shall identify the significant resources to be
- 17 conserved consistent with the purposes of this chapter and identify the
- 18 areas with potential for ((primitive recreation)) low-impact public and
- 19 environmental educational uses. The plan shall specify what types of
- 20 management activities ((will be)) and public uses that are permitted,
- 21 consistent with the conservation purposes of this chapter. The
- 22 department shall make such plans available for review and comment by
- 23 the public and other state, tribal, and local agencies, prior to final
- 24 approval by the commissioner.
- 25 **Sec. 7.** RCW 79.71.080 and 1987 c 472 s 8 are each amended to read
- 26 as follows:

- 1 The department is authorized to administer natural ((resource[s]))
- 2 <u>resources</u> conservation areas and may enter into management agreements
- 3 for these areas with ((other)) federal agencies, state agencies, local
- 4 governments, and private nonprofit conservancy corporations, as defined
- 5 in RCW 64.04.130, when such agreements are consistent with the purposes
- 6 of acquisition as defined in the adopted ((site)) management plan. All
- 7 management activities within a Washington natural resources
- 8 conservation area will conform with the plan. Any moneys derived from
- 9 the management of these areas in conformance with the adopted plan
- 10 shall be deposited in the <u>natural resources conservation areas</u>
- 11 stewardship account ((established in RCW 79.71.090)).
- 12 Sec. 8. RCW 79.71.090 and 1987 c 472 s 9 are each amended to read
- 13 as follows:
- 14 There is hereby created the natural resources conservation areas
- 15 stewardship account in the state treasury to ensure proper and
- 16 continuing management of land acquired or designated pursuant to this
- 17 chapter. Funds for the stewardship account shall be derived from
- 18 appropriations of state general funds, federal funds, grants,
- 19 donations, gifts, bond issue receipts, securities, and other monetary
- 20 instruments of value. Income derived from the management of natural
- 21 resources conservation areas shall also be deposited in this
- 22 stewardship account.
- 23 Appropriations from this account to the department shall be
- 24 expended for no other purpose than to manage the areas approved by the
- 25 legislature in fulfilling the purposes of this chapter, property
- 26 acquired as natural area preserves under chapter 79.70 RCW, and
- 27 property transferred under the authority and appropriation provided by
- 28 the legislature to be managed under chapters 79.70 and 79.71 RCW or
- 29 acquired under chapter 43.98A RCW.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** The balance in the conservation area
- 2 account is transferred to the natural resources conservation areas
- 3 stewardship account under RCW 79.71.090.
