
HOUSE BILL 1310

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to voter registration by mail; amending RCW
2 29.10.180; adding a new chapter to Title 29 RCW; repealing RCW
3 29.07.040; prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** Unless the context clearly requires
6 otherwise, "by mail" means delivery of a completed original voter
7 registration form by mail, by personal delivery, or by courier to a
8 county auditor.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** The county auditor is responsible for
10 the conduct of voter registration under this chapter within the county.
11 Except where inconsistent with this chapter, the remaining provisions
12 of Title 29 RCW apply to registration by mail.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** Any elector of this state may register
2 to vote by mail under this chapter.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** The county auditor shall distribute
4 forms by which a person may register to vote by mail and cancel any
5 previous registration in this state. The county auditor shall keep a
6 supply of voter registration forms in his or her office at all times
7 for political parties and others interested in assisting in voter
8 registration, and shall make every effort to make these forms generally
9 available to the public. The county auditor shall provide voter
10 registration forms to city and town clerks, state offices, schools,
11 fire stations, and any other locations considered appropriate by the
12 auditor for extending registration opportunities to all areas of the
13 county. After the initial distribution of voter registration forms to
14 a given location, a representative designated by the official in charge
15 of that location shall notify the county auditor of the need for
16 additional voter registration supplies.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** In addition to the information required
18 under RCW 29.07.070, when registering to vote by mail under this
19 chapter, the applicant shall provide his or her driver's license number
20 from a valid Washington state driver's license.

21 If the applicant does not have a valid Washington state driver's
22 license, then the applicant shall provide his or her social security
23 number.

24 If the applicant does not have a valid Washington state driver's
25 license or a social security number, then the applicant shall provide
26 the number from his or her valid Washington state identicard.

1 If the applicant does not provide the information required in this
2 section, the county auditor shall not process the form until the
3 information is provided.

4 The applicant shall sign a portion of the form that can be used as
5 an initiative signature card for the verification of petition
6 signatures by the secretary of state and shall sign and attest to the
7 following oath: "I declare that the facts relating to my
8 qualifications as a voter recorded on this voter registration form are
9 true. I am a citizen of the United States, I am not presently denied
10 my civil rights as a result of being convicted of an infamous crime, I
11 will have lived in this state, county, and precinct thirty days
12 immediately preceding the next election at which I offer to vote, and
13 I will be at least eighteen years of age at the time of voting."

14 The voter registration by mail form shall provide, in a conspicuous
15 place, the following warning: "Knowingly providing false information
16 on this voter registration form or knowingly making a false declaration
17 about your qualifications for registration is a class C felony
18 punishable by imprisonment for up to five years, or by a fine not to
19 exceed ten thousand dollars, or by both such imprisonment and fine."

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** A person qualified to vote who wishes to
21 register to vote, but who cannot provide the information required under
22 section 5 of this act, may register in person under chapter 29.07 RCW.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** On receipt of an application for voter
24 registration under this chapter, the county auditor shall review the
25 application to determine whether the information supplied is complete.
26 If it is not, the auditor shall promptly send notice of the deficiency
27 to the applicant. If the information is complete, the applicant is
28 registered as of the date of the application's postmark. If there is

1 no postmark or if the postmark is illegible, the applicant is
2 registered on the date the complete and correct application was
3 received by the auditor. The auditor shall record the appropriate
4 precinct identification, taxing district identification, and date of
5 registration on the voter's record. Within forty-five days after the
6 receipt of an application but no later than seven days before the next
7 primary, special election, or general election, the auditor shall send
8 to the applicant, by first class mail, a voter registration card
9 identifying the registrant's precinct and containing such other
10 information as may be required by the secretary of state. The postal
11 service shall be instructed not to forward a voter registration card to
12 any other address and to return to the auditor any card which is not
13 deliverable.

14 If a voter registration card is properly mailed as required by this
15 section to the address listed by the applicant as being the applicant's
16 mailing address and the card is subsequently returned to the auditor by
17 the postal service as being undeliverable to the applicant at that
18 address, the voter registration of the applicant shall be immediately
19 canceled. The auditor shall promptly send the applicant a notice and
20 explanation of the cancellation, and a registration application form.
21 The postal service shall be requested to forward this notice as
22 applicable.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** Ninety days prior to a general election,
24 the county auditor shall sample ten percent of the mail-in applications
25 for voter registration received following the previous general
26 election. If ten percent or more of the applications sampled are found
27 to be either fraudulent or inaccurate, the county auditor shall audit
28 all mail-in applications received during that period.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 9.** The secretary of state shall adopt an
2 application form for registering by mail under RCW 29.07.140. An
3 applicant registering to vote by mail shall be required to complete
4 only one form and to provide the required information, other than his
5 or her signature, no more than once. The form shall also contain
6 instructions on its use, a notification of filing deadlines, a warning
7 to the applicant of the penalty for knowingly supplying false
8 information, and space for the county auditor to enter the voter's
9 precinct identification, taxing district identification, and
10 registration number. The secretary of state shall develop the forms in
11 consultation with the county auditors.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 10.** The secretary of state shall furnish
13 registration forms necessary to carry out the registration of voters as
14 provided by this chapter without cost to the respective counties.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 11.** Violations of this chapter shall be
16 prosecuted under RCW 29.85.190, 29.85.200, or any other applicable
17 sections of chapter 29.85 RCW.

18 **Sec. 12.** RCW 29.10.180 and 1989 c 261 s 1 are each amended to read
19 as follows:

20 (1) Whenever any vote-by-mail ballot, notification to voters
21 following reprecincting of the county, notification to voters of
22 selection to serve on jury duty, or (~~initial~~) voter identification
23 card other than a voter identification card issued under section 7 of
24 this act is returned by the postal service as undeliverable, the county
25 auditor shall, in every instance, inquire into the validity of the
26 registration of that voter.

1 (2) The county auditor shall initiate his or her inquiry by
2 sending, by first-class mail, a written notice to the challenged voter
3 at the address indicated on the voter's permanent registration record
4 and to any other address at which the county auditor could reasonably
5 expect mail to be received by the voter. The county auditor shall not
6 request any restriction on the forwarding of such notice by the postal
7 service. The notice shall contain the nature of the inquiry and
8 provide a suitable form for reply. The notice shall also contain a
9 warning that the county auditor must receive a response within forty-
10 five days from the date of mailing or the individual's voter
11 registration will be canceled.

12 (3) The voter, in person or in writing, may state that the
13 information on the permanent voter registration record is correct or
14 may request a change in the address information on the permanent
15 registration record no later than the forty-fifth day after the date of
16 mailing the inquiry.

17 (4) Upon the timely receipt of a response signed by the voter, the
18 county auditor shall consider the inquiry satisfied and will make any
19 address corrections requested by the voter on the permanent
20 registration record. The county auditor shall cancel the registration
21 of a voter who fails to respond to the notice of inquiry within forty-
22 five days after the date of mailing.

23 (5) The county auditor shall notify any voter whose registration
24 has been canceled by sending, by first class mail, a written notice to
25 the address indicated on the voter's permanent registration record and
26 to any other address to which the original inquiry was sent. Upon
27 receipt of a satisfactory voter response, the auditor shall reinstate
28 the voter.

29 (6) A voter whose registration has been canceled under this section
30 and who offers to vote at the next ensuing election shall be issued a

1 questioned ballot. Upon receipt of such a questioned ballot the
2 auditor shall investigate the circumstances surrounding the original
3 cancellation. If he or she determines that the cancellation was in
4 error, the voter's registration shall be immediately reinstated, and
5 the voter's questioned ballot shall be counted. If the original
6 cancellation was not in error, the voter shall be afforded the
7 opportunity to reregister at his or her correct address, and the
8 voter's questioned ballot shall not be counted.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 13.** Sections 1 through 11 of this act shall
10 constitute a new chapter in Title 29 RCW.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 14.** RCW 29.07.040 and 1971 ex.s. c 202 s 6
12 & 1965 c 9 s 29.07.040 are each repealed.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 15.** Sections 1 through 11 and 14 of this act
14 take effect on January 1, 1992.
