
ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1314

- 1 AN ACT Relating to a fish and wildlife work force; adding a new
- 2 chapter to Title 50 RCW; providing an effective date; providing an
- 3 expiration date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that an increase
- 6 in unemployment due to the declining timber economy in the state is
- 7 imminent. The legislature further recognizes that employment
- 8 opportunities in state and local government in other natural resource
- 9 management professions exist and that dislocated workers in the timber-
- 10 related professions represent a potential work force in the areas of
- 11 fisheries, wildlife, and recreation.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 13 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 14 chapter.

- 1 (1) "Dislocated timber worker" means any individual who:
- 2 (a) Has been terminated or received a notice of termination from
- 3 employment in a timber-related occupation within standard industrial
- 4 code 024; and
- 5 (b) At the time of last separation from employment, resided in or
- 6 was employed in a timber-dependent community.
- 7 (2) "Department" means the employment security department.
- 8 (3) "Project" means the natural resource worker project.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The department, subject to the 10 availability of funding under section 4 of this act or an appropriation 11 from the general fund, shall establish the natural resource worker
- 12 project. The project shall terminate on July 1, 1996, and shall
- 13 provide employment and training opportunities for dislocated timber
- 14 workers in the areas of fisheries, wildlife, recreation, and other
- 15 natural resource professions. The department of personnel shall
- 16 approve the project. The goal of the project is to allow project
- 17 employees to be, upon termination of their participation in the
- 18 project, eligible for permanent employment with the departments of
- 19 wildlife, fisheries, ecology, and natural resources, and the parks and
- 20 recreation commission.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The department shall use federal funds
- 22 that it receives for dislocated timber workers to contract with the
- 23 departments of wildlife, fisheries, ecology, and natural resources, and
- 24 the parks and recreation commission to hire project participants to
- 25 conduct tasks in the areas of fisheries, wildlife, forestry, ecology,
- 26 and recreation.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The project shall include the following
- 2 elements:
- 3 (1) Recruitment of dislocated timber workers;
- 4 (2) Placement in the departments of wildlife, fisheries, ecology,
- 5 and natural resources, and the parks and recreation commission;
- 6 (3) On-the-job training in entry-level natural resource management
- 7 skills;
- 8 (4) Comparable salaries and benefits to entry-level positions
- 9 already existing in the departments of wildlife, fisheries, ecology,
- 10 and natural resources, and the parks and recreation commission.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The department, along with the
- 12 departments of personnel, wildlife, fisheries, ecology, and natural
- 13 resources, and the parks and recreation commission shall report
- 14 annually to the legislature on November 1 of each year beginning
- 15 November 1, 1992, and until November 1, 1995.
- The report shall include, at a minimum, the following elements:
- 17 (1) The number of project employees;
- 18 (2) The number and description of positions filled, by agency;
- 19 (3) Training received;
- 20 (4) Duration of employment; and
- 21 (5) Placement in permanent positions.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Sections 1 through 6 of this act shall
- 23 constitute a new chapter in Title 50 RCW.
- 24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 25 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 26 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 27 effect July 15, 1991.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** This act shall expire August 1, 1996.
