- 1 AN ACT Relating to a fish and wildlife work force; adding a new
- 2 chapter to Title 50 RCW; providing an effective date; providing an
- 3 expiration date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that an increase
- 6 in unemployment due to the declining timber economy in the state is
- 7 imminent. The legislature further recognizes that employment
- 8 opportunities in state and local government in other natural resource
- 9 management professions exist and that dislocated workers in the timber-
- 10 related professions represent a potential work force in the areas of
- 11 fisheries, wildlife, and recreation. In Skagit county, unemployment
- 12 due to a timber supply reduction is expected; however, an increase in
- 13 other natural resource positions for Skagit river enhancement is
- 14 expected in the next few years.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 2 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 3 chapter.
- 4 (1) "Dislocated timber worker" means any individual who:
- 5 (a) Has been terminated or received a notice of termination from
- 6 employment in a timber-related occupation;
- 7 (b) Is eligible for or has exhausted entitlement to unemployment
- 8 compensation benefits; and
- 9 (c) Is unlikely to return to employment in the individual's
- 10 principal occupation or previous industry because of a diminishing
- 11 demand for their skills in that occupation or industry.
- 12 (2) "Department" means the employment security department.
- 13 (3) "Project" means the natural resource worker project.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **Sec. 3**. The department, subject to the
- 15 availability of funding under section 4 of this act or an appropriation
- 16 from the general fund, shall establish the natural resource worker
- 17 project. The project shall be located in Skagit county, shall
- 18 terminate on July 1, 1996, and shall provide employment and training
- 19 opportunities for dislocated timber workers in the areas of fisheries,
- 20 wildlife, recreation, and other natural resource professions. The
- 21 department of personnel shall approve the project. The goal of the
- 22 project is to allow project employees to be, upon termination of their
- 23 participation in the project, eligible for permanent employment with
- 24 the departments of wildlife, fisheries, ecology, and natural resources,
- 25 and the parks and recreation commission.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The department shall use federal funds
- 27 that it receives for dislocated timber workers to contract with the
- 28 departments of wildlife, fisheries, ecology, and natural resources, and

- 1 the parks and recreation commission to hire project participants to
- 2 conduct tasks in the areas of fisheries, wildlife, forestry, ecology,
- 3 and recreation.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The project shall include the following
- 5 elements:
- 6 (1) Recruitment of dislocated timber workers;
- 7 (2) Placement in the departments of wildlife, fisheries, ecology,
- 8 and natural resources, and the parks and recreation commission;
- 9 (3) On-the-job training in entry-level natural resource management
- 10 skills;
- 11 (4) Comparable salaries and benefits to entry-level positions
- 12 already existing in the departments of wildlife, fisheries, ecology,
- 13 and natural resources, and the parks and recreation commission.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The department, along with the
- 15 departments of personnel, wildlife, fisheries, ecology, and natural
- 16 resources, and the parks and recreation commission shall report
- 17 annually to the legislature on November 1 of each year beginning
- 18 November 1, 1992, and until November 1, 1995.
- 19 The report shall include, at a minimum, the following elements:
- 20 (1) The number of project employees;
- 21 (2) The number and description of positions filled, by agency;
- 22 (3) Training received;
- 23 (4) Duration of employment; and
- 24 (5) Placement in permanent positions.
- 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Sections 1 through 6 of this act shall
- 26 constitute a new chapter in Title 50 RCW.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 3 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 4 effect July 15, 1991.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** This act shall expire August 1, 1996.
