## ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1315

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to a fish and wildlife work force; adding a new
- 2 chapter to Title 50 RCW; providing an effective date; providing an
- 3 expiration date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that an increase
- 6 in unemployment due to the declining timber economy in the state is
- 7 imminent. The legislature further recognizes that employment
- 8 opportunities in other natural resource management professions exist
- 9 and that natural resource enhancements in the areas of fisheries,
- 10 wildlife, and recreation can bring needed income to distressed local
- 11 economies in the state. It is the intent of the legislature that
- 12 dislocated timber workers be given training in and opportunities to
- 13 compete for employment in other resource management professions, and to
- 14 establish a pilot program in Skagit county to accomplish this
- 15 objective. The Skagit river represents a potential recreational

- 1 fishery that, if enhanced, will bring much needed income to Skagit
- 2 county. Enhancements to the fishery on the Skagit river are planned
- 3 over the next several years, and workers will be needed to fill these
- 4 positions. Displaced timber workers will be available to do this
- 5 work.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 7 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 8 chapter.
- 9 (1) "Department" means the employment security department.
- 10 (2) "Dislocated timber worker" means any individual who:
- 11 (a) Has been terminated or received a notice of termination from
- 12 employment in a timber-related occupation within standard industrial
- 13 code 024; and
- 14 (b) At the time of last separation from employment, resided in or
- 15 was employed in a timber-dependent community.
- 16 (3) "College" means Skagit Valley Community College.
- 17 (4) "Local development agency" means the economic development
- 18 association of Skagit county.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A pilot project shall be established,
- 20 coordinated jointly by the department and the college, in Skagit
- 21 county. The pilot project created in this section is subject to the
- 22 department and the college acquiring funds for the pilot project from
- 23 federal, state, or private sources. The project shall be of five years
- 24 duration.
- 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The college shall develop a training
- 26 program designed for dislocated timber workers and their spouses, and
- 27 in doing so, shall:

- 1 (1) Consult with, at a minimum, the departments of natural
- 2 resources, ecology, wildlife, and fisheries, the parks and recreation
- 3 commission, and other state, federal, local, and private employers in
- 4 Skagit county to determine minimum employment qualifications in the
- 5 areas of natural resource management and enhancement of the Skagit
- 6 river; and
- 7 (2) Develop a program that will provide needed educational skills
- 8 to dislocated timber workers and their spouses.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The department shall contract with the
- 10 local development agency to coordinate with the college and the
- 11 departments of wildlife, ecology, natural resources, and fisheries, the
- 12 parks and recreation commission, and other state, federal, local, and
- 13 private employers in assisting dislocated timber workers and their
- 14 spouses in securing education and employment in the natural resource
- 15 professions. The local development agency shall also provide
- 16 information on the training program established under section 4 of this
- 17 act.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The department and the college shall
- 19 jointly report to the legislature on their progress by November 1 of
- 20 each year, beginning in 1991 and ending November 1, 1996. This report
- 21 shall include a college program description, numbers of students,
- 22 numbers of referrals for existing positions by the local development
- 23 agency, and numbers of positions filled by dislocated timber workers.
- 24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. This act shall expire January 1, 1997.
- 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** Sections 1 through 7 of this act shall
- 26 constitute a new chapter in Title 50 RCW.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 3 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 4 effect July 15, 1991.
