- 1 AN ACT Relating to sunset review responsibilities of the
- 2 legislative budget committee; amending RCW 43.131.120 and 43.06.010;
- 3 and repealing RCW 43.131.115 and 43.131.118.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.131.120 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 27 s 7 are each
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1) The <u>legislative budget</u> committee shall be responsible for
- 8 monitoring the schedule of agencies to be reviewed under this chapter,
- 9 modifying this schedule to insure the effective operation of this
- 10 chapter, and performing other duties necessary for the implementation
- 11 of this chapter. ((The committee shall continue to be responsible for
- 12 the development of)) No later than January 15, 1993, and by January 15
- 13 of each odd-numbered year thereafter, the legislative budget committee
- 14 shall submit for consideration by the legislature legislation which
- 15 provides for the termination of state agencies as needed in a manner

- 1 consistent with the terms of this chapter ((and of RCW 43.06.010 as now
- 2 or hereafter amended)) or which modifies as needed the schedule of
- 3 agencies to be reviewed under this chapter. If necessary to ensure the
- 4 <u>effective operation of this chapter, the legislative budget committee</u>
- 5 may also submit such legislation in an even-numbered year. In the
- 6 development of such legislation, the ((select joint)) legislative
- 7 <u>budget</u> committee shall:
- 8 (a) Identify state agencies which might appropriately be scheduled
- 9 for termination under subsection (2) of this section. No more than one
- 10 state agency shall be so identified or scheduled for automatic
- 11 termination in any one section of such legislation;
- 12 (b) Seek to schedule state agencies with like goals, objectives, or
- 13 functions for termination on the same date so as to better assure
- 14 identification of duplicative activities and provide for appropriate
- 15 modification or consolidation of state agencies to avoid future
- 16 duplication; ((and))
- 17 (c) Seek to schedule state agencies for termination in a manner
- 18 which assures that as many committees of reference as possible have
- 19 sufficient opportunity to develop experience in conducting reviews as
- 20 provided pursuant to the terms of this chapter, and which assures that
- 21 no such committee is given responsibility for review of an unreasonable
- 22 number of state agencies during any legislative session \underline{i}
- 23 (d) Seek recommendations from and consult with committees of
- 24 reference having governmental oversight responsibilities, including the
- 25 house committees on state government and appropriations and the senate
- 26 committees on governmental operations and ways and means, or their
- 27 <u>successors;</u> and
- 28 (e) Consider any recommendations submitted by the governor under
- 29 RCW 43.06.010.

- 1 (2) In identifying those state agencies to be scheduled for
- 2 termination, the ((select joint)) legislative budget committee shall
- 3 consider, but not be limited to, the following factors where
- 4 applicable:
- 5 (a) The extent to which the burden of compliance on the executive
- 6 and legislative branches with the terms of this chapter is reasonable;
- 7 (b) The extent to which a state agency may serve the interests of
- 8 a particular profession, occupation, or industry as opposed to the
- 9 interests of the public;
- 10 (c) The extent to which a state agency may have outlived its
- 11 original statutory purpose; and
- 12 (d) The potential for fiscal savings.
- 13 (3) The ((select joint)) legislative budget committee may propose
- 14 procedures which facilitate legislative review as required by this
- 15 chapter for presentation to the legislature. The committee may
- 16 recommend legislative rules which assure effective and appropriate
- 17 consideration of all bills and reports regarding termination,
- 18 modification, consolidation, or reauthorization of state agencies
- 19 scheduled for termination.
- 20 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.06.010 and 1982 c 153 s 1 are each amended to read
- 21 as follows:
- In addition to those prescribed by the Constitution, the governor
- 23 may exercise the powers and perform the duties prescribed in this and
- 24 the following sections:
- 25 (1) The governor shall supervise the conduct of all executive and
- 26 ministerial offices;
- 27 (2) The governor shall see that all offices are filled, and the
- 28 duties thereof performed, or in default thereof, apply such remedy as

- 1 the law allows; and if the remedy is imperfect, acquaint the
- 2 legislature therewith at its next session;
- 3 (3) The governor shall make the appointments and supply the
- 4 vacancies mentioned in this title;
- 5 (4) The governor is the sole official organ of communication
- 6 between the government of this state and the government of any other
- 7 state or territory, or of the United States;
- 8 (5) Whenever any suit or legal proceeding is pending against this
- 9 state, or which may affect the title of this state to any property, or
- 10 which may result in any claim against the state, the governor may
- 11 direct the attorney general to appear on behalf of the state, and
- 12 report the same to the governor, or to any grand jury designated by the
- 13 governor, or to the legislature when next in session;
- 14 (6) The governor may require the attorney general or any
- 15 prosecuting attorney to inquire into the affairs or management of any
- 16 corporation existing under the laws of this state, or doing business in
- 17 this state, and report the same to the governor, or to any grand jury
- 18 designated by the governor, or to the legislature when next in session;
- 19 (7) The governor may require the attorney general to aid any
- 20 prosecuting attorney in the discharge of his duties;
- 21 (8) The governor may offer rewards, not exceeding one thousand
- 22 dollars in each case, payable out of the state treasury, for
- 23 information leading to the apprehension of any person convicted of a
- 24 felony who has escaped from a state correctional institution or for
- 25 information leading to the arrest of any person who has committed or is
- 26 charged with the commission of a felony;
- 27 (9) The governor shall perform such duties respecting fugitives
- 28 from justice as are prescribed by law;
- 29 (10) The governor shall issue and transmit election proclamations
- 30 as prescribed by law;

- 1 (11) The governor may require any officer or board to make, upon
- 2 demand, special reports to the governor, in writing;
- 3 (12) The governor may, after finding that a public disorder,
- 4 disaster, energy emergency, or riot exists within this state or any
- 5 part thereof which affects life, health, property, or the public peace,
- 6 proclaim a state of emergency in the area affected, and the powers
- 7 granted the governor during a state of emergency shall be effective
- 8 only within the area described in the proclamation;
- 9 (13) The governor shall, when appropriate, submit to the ((select
- 10 joint)) legislative budget committee ((created by RCW 43.131.120)),
- 11 lists of state agencies, as defined by RCW 43.131.030, which agencies
- 12 might appropriately be scheduled for termination by a bill proposed by
- 13 the ((select joint)) legislative budget committee;
- 14 (14) The governor may, after finding that there exists within this
- 15 state an imminent danger of infestation of plant pests as defined in
- 16 RCW 17.24.005 or plant diseases which seriously endangers the
- 17 agricultural or horticultural industries of the state of Washington, or
- 18 which seriously threatens life, health, or economic well-being, order
- 19 emergency measures to prevent or abate the infestation or disease
- 20 situation, which measures, after thorough evaluation of all other
- 21 alternatives, may include the aerial application of pesticides.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The following acts or parts of acts are each
- 23 repealed:
- 24 (1) RCW 43.131.115 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 27 s 5; and
- 25 (2) RCW 43.13.118 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 27 s 6.
