
ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 1554

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to voter registration verification procedures; and
- 2 amending RCW 29.10.180.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 29.10.180 and 1989 c 261 s 1 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The county auditor may enter one or more contracts with the
- 7 United States postal service, or its licensee, which permit the auditor
- 8 to use postal service change-of-address information. If the auditor
- 9 finds that information received under such a contract gives the
- 10 appearance that a voter has changed his or her residence address, the
- 11 auditor shall notify the voter concerning the requirements of state and
- 12 federal laws governing voter registration and residence.
- 13 (2) Whenever any vote-by-mail ballot, notification to voters
- 14 following reprecincting of the county, notification to voters of
- 15 selection to serve on jury duty, notification under subsection (1) of

- 1 this section, or initial voter identification card is returned by the
- 2 postal service as undeliverable, the county auditor shall, in every
- 3 instance, inquire into the validity of the registration of that voter.
- 4 $((\frac{(2)}{(2)}))$ (3) The county auditor shall initiate his or her inquiry by
- 5 sending, by first-class mail, a written notice to the challenged voter
- 6 at the address indicated on the voter's permanent registration record
- 7 and to any other address at which the county auditor could reasonably
- 8 expect mail to be received by the voter. The county auditor shall not
- 9 request any restriction on the forwarding of such notice by the postal
- 10 service. The notice shall contain the nature of the inquiry and
- 11 provide a suitable form for reply. The notice shall also contain a
- 12 warning that the county auditor must receive a response within forty-
- 13 five days from the date of mailing or the individual's voter
- 14 registration will be canceled.
- 15 (((3))) (4) The voter, in person or in writing, may state that the
- 16 information on the permanent voter registration record is correct or
- 17 may request a change in the address information on the permanent
- 18 registration record no later than the forty-fifth day after the date of
- 19 mailing the inquiry.
- 20 (((4))) (5) Upon the timely receipt of a response signed by the
- 21 voter, the county auditor shall consider the inquiry satisfied and will
- 22 make any address corrections requested by the voter on the permanent
- 23 registration record. The county auditor shall cancel the registration
- 24 of a voter who fails to respond to the notice of inquiry within forty-
- 25 five days after the date of mailing.
- 26 $((\frac{5}{}))$ (6) The county auditor shall notify any voter whose
- 27 registration has been canceled by sending, by first class mail, a
- 28 written notice to the address indicated on the voter's permanent
- 29 registration record and to any other address to which the original

- 1 inquiry was sent. Upon receipt of a satisfactory voter response, the
- 2 auditor shall reinstate the voter.
- (((6))) (7) A voter whose registration has been canceled under this
- 4 section and who offers to vote at the next ensuing election shall be
- 5 issued a questioned ballot. Upon receipt of such a questioned ballot
- 6 the auditor shall investigate the circumstances surrounding the
- 7 original cancellation. If he or she determines that the cancellation
- 8 was in error, the voter's registration shall be immediately reinstated,
- 9 and the voter's questioned ballot shall be counted. If the original
- 10 cancellation was not in error, the voter shall be afforded the
- 11 opportunity to reregister at his or her correct address, and the
- 12 voter's questioned ballot shall not be counted.
