Read first time February 7, 1991. Referred to Committee on Agriculture & Rural Development\Commerce & Labor.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to pesticide posting and record keeping; amending
- 2 RCW 17.21.100, 49.70.117, and 49.70.119; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 17.21.100 and 1989 c 380 s 39 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) ((Except as provided in subsection (7) of this section,
- 7 pesticide)) Applicators licensed under the provisions of this chapter
- 8 and all persons applying pesticides to more than one acre of
- 9 agricultural land in a calendar year, including public entities engaged
- 10 in roadside spraying of pesticides, shall keep all required records,
- 11 and submit to the director any records requested by the director on a
- 12 form prescribed by the director which shall include the following
- 13 information:
- 14 (a) The location of the land where the pesticide was applied.
- 15 (b) The year, month, day and time the pesticide was applied.

- 1 (c) The product name used on the registered label and the United
- 2 States environmental protection agency registration number, if
- 3 applicable, of the pesticide which was applied.
- 4 (d) The crop or site to which the pesticide was applied.
- 5 (e) The amount of pesticide applied per acre or other appropriate
- 6 measure.
- 7 (f) The concentration of pesticide that was applied.
- 8 (g) The number of acres, or other appropriate measure, to which the
- 9 pesticide was applied.
- 10 (h) The licensed applicator's name, address, and telephone number
- 11 and the name of the individual or individuals making the application.
- 12 (i) The direction and estimated velocity of the wind at the time
- 13 the pesticide was applied: PROVIDED, That this subsection (i) shall
- 14 not apply to applications of baits in bait stations and pesticide
- 15 applications within structures.
- 16 (j) Any other reasonable information required by the director.
- 17 (2) Records shall be updated on the same day that a pesticide is
- 18 applied.
- 19 (3) Such records shall be kept for a period of seven years from the
- 20 date of the application of the pesticide to which such records refer,
- 21 and the director shall, upon request in writing, be furnished with a
- 22 copy of such records forthwith by the licensee: PROVIDED, That the
- 23 director may require the submission of such records within thirty days
- 24 of the application of any restricted use pesticide in prescribed areas
- 25 controlling the use of such restricted use pesticide.
- 26 (4) The pesticide records shall be readily available to: The
- 27 department; treating medical personnel initiating diagnostic testing or
- 28 therapy for a patient with a suspected case of pesticide poisoning; the
- 29 department of social and health services; the pesticide incident
- 30 reporting and tracking panel; and, in the case of an industrial

- 1 insurance claim filed under Title 51 RCW with the department of labor
- 2 and industries, the employee or the employee's designated
- 3 representative and the department of labor and industries.
- 4 (5) If a request for information is made under subsection (4) of
- 5 this section from an applicator referred to in subsection (1) of this
- 6 section and the applicator refuses to provide a copy of the records,
- 7 the department shall be notified of the request and the applicator's
- 8 refusal. Within seven working days, the department shall request that
- 9 the applicator provide the department with all pertinent copies, except
- 10 that in a medical emergency the request shall be made within two
- 11 working days. The applicator shall provide copies of the records to
- 12 the department within twenty-four hours after the department's request.
- 13 (6) The department of agriculture and the department of labor and
- 14 industries shall jointly adopt, by rule, ((one)) a form that satisfies
- 15 the information requirements of this section and RCW 49.70.119.
- 16 Records ((kept)) submitted on the prescribed form under RCW 49.70.119
- 17 may be used to comply with this section.
- 18  $((\frac{7}{1})$  This section shall not apply to the owner or operator of a
- 19 dairy farm with respect to his or her application of pesticides to the
- 20 <del>farm.</del>))
- 21 **Sec. 2.** RCW 49.70.117 and 1989 c 380 s 76 are each amended to read
- 22 as follows:
- 23 (1) If a pesticide having a reentry interval of greater than
- 24 twenty-four hours is applied to a labor-intensive agricultural crop,
- 25 the pesticide-treated area shall be posted with warning signs in
- 26 accordance with the requirements of this section.
- 27 (2) When pesticide warning signs are required under this section,
- 28 the employer shall post signs visible from all usual points of entry to
- 29 the pesticide-treated area. If there are no usual points of entry or

- 1 the area is adjacent to an unfenced public right of way, signs shall be
- 2 posted (a) at each corner of the pesticide-treated area, and (b) at
- 3 intervals not exceeding six hundred feet, or (c) at other locations
- 4 approved by the department that provide maximum visibility.
- 5 (3) The signs shall be posted ((no sooner than twenty-four hours))
- 6 before the ((scheduled)) application of the pesticide but not more than
- 7 seven days prior to the scheduled application, remain posted during
- 8 application and throughout the applicable reentry interval, and be
- 9 removed within two days after the expiration of the applicable reentry
- 10 interval and before employee reentry is permitted. Employees working
- in an area scheduled for a pesticide application shall be informed of
- 12 the application and shall vacate the area to be sprayed prior to
- 13 application of the pesticide.
- 14 (4) Signs shall be legible for the duration of use. Signs shall
- 15 contain a prominent symbol approved by the department of agriculture
- 16 and the department of labor and industries by rule, and wording shall
- 17 be in English and Spanish or other languages as required by the
- 18 department. Signs shall meet the minimum specifications of rules
- 19 adopted by the department, which rules shall include, at a minimum,
- 20 size and lettering requirements.
- 21 **Sec. 3.** RCW 49.70.119 and 1989 c 380 s 77 are each amended to read
- 22 as follows:
- 23 (1) An employer who ((applies or)) stores pesticides in connection
- 24 with the production of an agricultural crop shall compile and maintain
- 25 a workplace pesticide list ((by crop)) for each pesticide that is
- 26 ((applied to a crop or)) stored in a work area. The workplace pesticide
- 27 list shall be kept on a form prescribed by the department and shall
- 28 contain at least the following information:

- 1 (a) The location of the land where the pesticide was ((applied or
- 2 site where the pesticide was)) stored;
- 3 (b) The year, month, day, and time the pesticide was ((applied))
- 4 first stored;
- 5 (c) The product name used on the registered label and the United
- 6 States environmental protection agency registration number, if
- 7 applicable, of the pesticide that was ((applied or)) stored $((\dot{\tau})$
- 8 (d) The crop or site to which the pesticide was applied;
- 9 (e) The amount of pesticide applied per acre, or other appropriate
- 10 measure;
- 11 (f) The concentration of pesticide that was applied;
- 12 (g) The number of acres, or other appropriate measure, to which
- 13 pesticide was applied;
- 14 (h) If applicable, the licensed applicator's name, address, and
- 15 telephone number and the name of the individual or individuals making
- 16 the application; and
- 17 (i) The direction and estimated velocity of the wind at the time
- 18 the pesticide was applied: PROVIDED, That this subsection (i) shall
- 19 not apply to applications of baits in bait stations and pesticide
- 20 applications within structures)).
- 21 (2) The employer shall update the workplace pesticide list on the
- 22 same day that a pesticide is ((applied or is first)) stored in a work
- 23 area.
- 24 (3) The workplace pesticide list may be prepared for the workplace
- 25 as a whole or for each work area and must be readily available to
- 26 employees and their designated representatives. New or newly assigned
- 27 employees shall be made aware of the pesticide chemical list before
- 28 working with pesticides or in a work area containing pesticides.
- 29 (4) An employer subject to this section shall maintain ((one)) <u>a</u>
- 30 form for each  $((\frac{\text{crop}_{\tau}}{\tau}))$  work area $((\frac{\tau}{\tau}))$  or workplace as a whole, as

- 1 appropriate, and shall add information to the form as different
- 2 pesticides are ((applied or)) stored. The forms shall be accessible
- 3 and available for copying and shall be stored in a location suitable to
- 4 preserve their physical integrity. The employer shall maintain and
- 5 preserve the forms required under this section for no less than seven
- 6 years. The records shall include an estimation of the total amount of
- 7 each pesticide listed on the forms.
- 8 (5) An employer who applies pesticides in connection with the
- 9 production of an agricultural crop shall maintain records in accordance
- 10 with the provisions of RCW 17.21.100. Such records shall be available
- 11 to the director of the department of labor and industries, upon
- 12 request.
- 13 (6) After July 23, 1989, if an employer has failed to maintain and
- 14 preserve the forms as required, the employer shall be subject to any
- 15 applicable penalties authorized under this chapter or chapter 49.17
- 16 RCW.
- 17 (((6))) (7) If activities for which forms are maintained cease at
- 18 a workplace, the forms shall be filed with the department. If an
- 19 employer subject to this section is succeeded or replaced in that
- 20 function by another person, the person who succeeds or replaces the
- 21 employer shall retain the forms as required by this section but is not
- 22 liable for violations committed by the former employer under this
- 23 chapter or rules adopted under this chapter, including violations
- 24 relating to the retention and preservation of forms.
- 25  $((\frac{7}{1}))$  (8) The employer shall provide copies of the forms, on
- 26 request, to an employee or the employee's designated representative in
- 27 the case of an industrial insurance claim filed under Title 51 RCW with
- 28 the department of labor and industries, treating medical personnel, the
- 29 pesticide incident reporting and tracking review panel, or department
- 30 representative. The designated representative or treating medical

- 1 personnel are not required to identify the employee represented or
- 2 treated. The department shall keep the name of any affected employee
- 3 confidential in accordance with RCW 49.17.080(1). If an employee, a
- 4 designated representative, treating medical personnel, or the pesticide
- 5 incident reporting and tracking review panel requests a copy of a form
- 6 and the employer refuses to provide a copy, the requester shall notify
- 7 the department of the request and the employer's refusal. Within seven
- 8 working days, the department shall request that the employer provide
- 9 the department with all pertinent copies, except that in a medical
- 10 emergency the request shall be made within two working days. The
- 11 employer shall provide copies of the form to the department within
- 12 twenty-four hours after the department's request.
- 13  $((\frac{8}{1}))$  The department of labor and industries and the
- 14 department of agriculture shall jointly adopt, by rule, ((one)) a form
- 15 that satisfies the information requirements of this section and RCW
- 16 17.21.100. Records ((kept)) submitted by the employer on the
- 17 prescribed form under RCW 17.21.100 may be used to comply with the
- 18 workplace pesticide list information requirements under this section.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 20 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 21 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 22 effect immediately.
