HOUSE BILL 1747

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to community stabilization activities; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 43.63A RCW; creating new sections; and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** This act may be known and cited as the
- 6 community stabilization act.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The legislature finds and declares
- 8 that:
- 9 (a) Families with children have been rendered homeless or are in
- 10 imminent danger of becoming homeless as a result of a sudden job loss
- 11 or other economic adversity;
- 12 (b) It is more economical and more socially desirable to enable
- 13 people to retain possession of their houses or apartments and thereby

- 1 avoid homelessness, than to house them in emergency shelters or in
- 2 other facilities intended for short-term occupancy; and
- 3 (c) Economically distressed communities are faced with unique
- 4 problems that require a comprehensive approach of housing and related
- 5 support services.
- 6 (2) The legislature declares that a program designed to provide
- 7 short-term financial assistance to assist with mortgage or rent
- 8 payments and coordination of available support services is needed to
- 9 keep people from becoming homeless.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 43.63A RCW
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (1) The department shall develop and administer a homelessness
- 13 prevention program for the purpose of providing grants and technical
- 14 assistance to eligible organizations to operate local homelessness
- 15 prevention and related support services programs. For purposes of this
- 16 section, "eligible organizations" are those organizations eligible to
- 17 receive assistance through the Washington housing trust fund, chapter
- 18 43.185 RCW.
- 19 (2) The department shall select at least five eligible
- 20 organizations for purposes of implementing local homelessness
- 21 prevention programs. The local homelessness prevention programs are
- 22 designed to provide: (a) Interest-free loans of temporary mortgage or
- 23 rental assistance on behalf of families with children in imminent
- 24 danger of losing housing as a result of having insufficient income to
- 25 pay mortgage or rental costs; (b) interest-free loans to make payments
- 26 on machinery or equipment that is essential to the household's
- 27 livelihood; or (c) technical assistance to eligible organizations to
- 28 help recipient eligible organizations develop and implement local
- 29 strategies to prevent homelessness. In selecting pilot programs under

- 1 this section, the department shall give priority consideration to areas
- 2 that are economically distressed as a result of displaced timber
- 3 workers and shall consider:
- 4 (i) The eligible organization's ability, stability, and resources
- 5 to implement the local homelessness prevention program;
- 6 (ii) The eligible organization's efforts to coordinate other
- 7 support programs for the family, such as job search or job retraining
- 8 programs; and
- 9 (iii) Other factors the department deems appropriate.
- 10 (3) The recipient eligible organization shall establish priorities
- 11 of eligibility for temporary mortgage or rental assistance to assist
- 12 families with children in retaining housing. The recipient eligible
- 13 organization shall make a determination of eligibility regarding the
- 14 family's eligibility to participate in the local homelessness
- 15 prevention program. A determination shall include, but is not limited
- 16 to:
- 17 (a) A determination that the family is subject to immediate
- 18 eviction for foreclosure of nonpayment of mortgage installments or
- 19 nonpayment of rent, when nonpayment is attributable to illness,
- 20 unemployment, underemployment, or any other failure of resources beyond
- 21 the person's control;
- 22 (b) A verification of the loss of income; and
- 23 (c) A determination that the family does not have the financial
- 24 resources to make the required mortgage installment or rental payment,
- 25 or installment payment on the equipment or machinery which is essential
- 26 to the family's livelihood.
- 27 (4) No family shall continue to receive temporary mortgage or
- 28 rental assistance under this section if alternative sources of mortgage
- 29 or rental assistance under federal, state, or local sources becomes
- 30 available.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 43.63A RCW
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 The department shall adopt rules to implement section 3 of this
- 4 act, including but not limited to:
- 5 (1) The maximum length of assistance available through section 3 of
- 6 this act;
- 7 (2) The eligibility of and application process for eligible
- 8 organizations;
- 9 (3) The criteria by which grants and technical assistance shall be
- 10 provided to eligible organizations; and
- 11 (4) The criteria eligible organizations shall use when entering
- 12 into contracts with families to make mortgage or rental assistance
- 13 payments, or equipment or machinery payments on their behalf.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The sum of seven hundred fifty thousand
- 15 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for
- 16 the biennium ending June 30, 1993, from the general fund to the
- 17 department of community development for the purposes of this act.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** If any provision of this act or its
- 19 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 20 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 21 persons or circumstances is not affected.
