- 1 AN ACT Relating to health care benefits for retired and disabled
- 2 state, local government, and common school employees; amending RCW
- 3 41.05.080 and 41.05.080; creating new sections; and providing an
- 4 effective date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that premium
- 7 rates for health care coverage currently offered by the state
- 8 employees' benefits board to retired and disabled state employees are
- 9 high, and consume an increasing proportion of the fixed income of such
- 10 retired and disabled individuals. The legislature further finds that
- 11 it is appropriate to continue to subsidize the high costs of health
- 12 care coverage for retired and disabled public employees, but that the
- 13 form and level of that subsidy, and mechanisms to fund and administer
- 14 such health care coverage, must be determined after careful study.

- 1 (2) It is the purpose of this act to comprehensively address issues
 2 relating to health care coverage for retired and disabled state, local
 3 government, and public school employees by authorizing the health care
 4 authority to offer a medicare supplement health insurance plan to
 5 retired and disabled state employees on an interim basis, and
 6 establishing a study commission to develop recommendations to the
 7 legislature regarding health care benefits for retired and disabled

Retired or disabled state employees, or employees of county, 11 municipal, or other political subdivisions covered by this chapter who 12 13 are retired, may continue their participation in insurance plans and contracts after retirement or disablement, under the qualifications, 14 terms, conditions, and benefits set by the board: PROVIDED, That the 15 16 rates charged such retired or disabled employees for health care will be developed from the same experience pool as active employees: 17 18 PROVIDED FURTHER, That ((such)) retired or disabled employees ((shall 19 bear the full cost of premiums required to provide such coverage)) 20 eligible for medicare may be offered health care coverage that differs from that available to active employees. Such retired or disabled employees 24 25 shall be responsible for payment of premium rates developed by the authority in accordance with this section: PROVIDED FURTHER, That such 26 27 self pay rates will be established based on a separate rate for the 28 employee, the spouse, and the children: PROVIDED FURTHER, That premium rates for a retired or disabled employee, spouse, or child who is 29

- 9 (a) Four legislators, one from each of the two largest caucuses in
- 10 the senate and the house of representatives, who shall be selected by
- 11 the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of
- 12 representatives and who serve on the senate ways and means committee or
- 13 the house of representatives appropriations committee;
- 14 (b) One member, to be selected by the governor, representing
- 15 retired state employees;
- 16 (c) One member, to be selected by the governor, representing
- 17 retired public school employees;
- 18 (d) One member, to be selected by the governor, representing
- 19 retired county, municipal or other local government employees covered
- 20 by chapter 41.05 RCW;
- 21 (e) One member, to be selected by the governor, representing active
- 22 state employees;
- 23 (f) One member, to be selected by the governor, representing active
- 24 public school employees;
- 25 (g) One member, to be selected by the governor, representing active
- 26 county, municipal, or other local government employees covered by
- 27 chapter 41.05 RCW; and
- 28 (h) Three members to represent the governor and executive agencies.

- 1 The legislative members shall select a chair from the members of
- 2 the commission. Except for members appointed under subsection (1)(b)
- 3 through (h) of this section who participate in the commission as part
- 4 of their regular employment, commission members shall be reimbursed for
- 5 travel expenses pursuant to RCW 43.03.050 and RCW 43.03.060.
- 6 (2) The commission shall study and develop recommendations
- 7 regarding health care coverage for retired and disabled state, local
- 8 government, and public school employees. The study should include, but
- 9 not be limited to, the following areas:
- 10 (a) Establishment of a mechanism to annually determine the level of
- 11 subsidy of retired and disabled employee's health care coverage premium
- 12 rates;
- 13 (b) Development of mechanisms to prefund health care coverage for
- 14 retired and disabled employees, through means such as contributions by
- 15 active employees to a fund established to finance future retired and
- 16 disabled employees' health care benefits, and voluntary contributions
- 17 by active employees to individual medical accounts from which funds can
- 18 be drawn upon retirement or becoming disabled to pay premiums and cost-
- 19 sharing for health care coverage;
- 20 (c) Establishment of variable health care coverage premium rates
- 21 for retired or disabled employees based upon the individual retired or
- 22 disabled individual's income;
- 23 (d) Health care coverage for retired or disabled public school
- 24 employees;
- 25 (e) Health care coverage for retired or disabled employees of
- 26 county, municipal or other local governments covered by chapter 41.05
- 27 RCW; and
- 28 (f) Any other areas deemed necessary by the commission.
- 29 The commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the
- 30 legislature on or before December 1, 1992.

- (3) The commission shall be staffed by the office of financial 1 2 management and staff from the appropriate committees of the house of representatives and the senate. The health care authority, office of 3 4 retirement systems, office of the actuary, and department of personnel 5 shall provide support to the commission, to the extent possible, 6 through the provision of technical expertise and data. The commission may form technical advisory committees to assist it with matters deemed 7 necessary by the commission. 8
