- 1 AN ACT Relating to excess levies by school districts; and amending
- 2 RCW 84.52.0531.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 84.52.0531 and 1990 c 33 s 601 are each amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 The maximum dollar amount which may be levied by or for any school
- 7 district for maintenance and operation support under the provisions of
- 8 RCW 84.52.053 shall be determined as follows:
- 9 (1) For excess levies for collection in calendar year 1991, the
- 10 maximum dollar amount shall be calculated pursuant to the laws and
- 11 rules in effect in November 1990.
- 12 (2) For the purpose of this section, the basic education allocation
- 13 shall be determined pursuant to RCW 28A.150.250, 28A.150.260, and
- 14 28A.150.350: PROVIDED, That when determining the basic education
- 15 allocation under subsection (4) of this section, nonresident full time

- 1 equivalent pupils who are participating in a program provided for in
- 2 chapter 28A.545 RCW or in any other program pursuant to an
- 3 interdistrict agreement shall be included in the enrollment of the
- 4 resident district and excluded from the enrollment of the serving
- 5 district.
- 6 (((2) For the purposes of subsection (5) of this section, a base
- 7 year levy percentage shall be established. The base year levy
- 8 percentage shall be equal to the greater of: (a) The district's actual
- 9 levy percentage for calendar year 1985, (b) the average levy percentage
- 10 for all school district levies in the state in calendar year 1985, or
- 11 (c) the average levy percentage for all school district levies in the
- 12 educational service district of the district in calendar year 1985.))
- 13 (3) For excess levies for collection in calendar year ((1988)) 1992
- 14 and thereafter, the maximum dollar amount shall be the ((total of)) sum
- 15 of (a) and (b) of this subsection minus (c) of this subsection:
- 16 (a) The district's levy base as defined in subsection (4) of this
- 17 section multiplied by ((the district's maximum levy percentage as
- 18 defined in subsections (5) and (6) of this section; plus)) thirty-three
- 19 and thirty-three hundredths percent;
- 20 (b) In the case of nonhigh school districts only, an amount equal
- 21 to the total estimated amount due by the nonhigh school district to
- 22 high school districts pursuant to chapter 28A.545 RCW for the school
- 23 year during which collection of the levy is to commence, less the
- 24 increase in the nonhigh school district's basic education allocation as
- 25 computed pursuant to subsection (1) of this section due to the
- 26 inclusion of pupils participating in a program provided for in chapter
- 27 28A.545 RCW in such computation; ((less))
- 28 (c) The maximum amount of state matching funds under RCW
- 29 28A.500.010 for which the district is eligible in that tax collection
- 30 year.

- 1 (4) For excess levies for collection in calendar year ((1988)) 1992
- 2 and thereafter, a district's levy base shall be the sum of ((the
- 3 following allocations received by the district)) selected state and
- 4 <u>federal allocations</u> for the prior school year, including allocations
- 5 for compensation increases, adjusted by the percent increase per full
- 6 time equivalent student in the state basic education appropriation
- 7 between the prior school year and the current school year((\div)) . A
- 8 <u>district's levy base shall not include local school district property</u>
- 9 tax levies or other local revenues, or state and federal allocations
- 10 not identified in (a) through (c) of this subsection.
- 11 (a) The district's basic education allocation as determined
- 12 pursuant to RCW 28A.150.250, 28A.150.260, and 28A.150.350;
- 13 (b) State and federal categorical allocations for the following
- 14 programs:
- 15 (i) Pupil transportation;
- 16 (ii) Handicapped education;
- 17 (iii) Education of highly capable students;
- 18 (iv) Compensatory education, including but not limited to learning
- 19 assistance, migrant education, Indian education, refugee programs, and
- 20 bilingual education;
- 21 (v) Food services; and
- 22 (vi) State-wide block grant programs; and
- 23 (c) Any other federal allocations for elementary and secondary
- 24 school programs, including direct grants, other than federal impact aid
- 25 funds and allocations in lieu of taxes.
- 26 (5) ((For levies to be collected in calendar year 1988, a
- 27 district's maximum levy percentage shall be determined as follows:
- 28 (a) Multiply the district's base year levy percentage as defined in
- 29 subsection (2) of this section by the district's levy base as
- 30 determined in subsection (4) of this section;

- 1 (b) Reduce the amount in (a) of this subsection by the total
- 2 estimated amount of any levy reduction funds as defined in subsection
- 3 (7) of this section which are to be allocated to the district for the
- 4 1987-88 school year;
- 5 (c) Divide the amount in (b) of this subsection by the district's
- 6 levy base to compute a new percentage; and
- 7 (d) The percentage in (c) of this subsection or twenty percent,
- 8 whichever is greater, shall be the district's maximum levy percentage
- 9 for levies collected in calendar year 1988.
- 10 (6) For excess levies for collection in calendar year 1989 and
- 11 thereafter, a district's maximum levy percentage shall be determined as
- 12 follows:
- 13 (a) Multiply the district's maximum levy percentage for the prior
- 14 year or thirty percent, whichever is less, by the district's levy base
- 15 as determined in subsection (4) of this section;
- 16 (b) Reduce the amount in (a) of this subsection by the total
- 17 estimated amount of any levy reduction funds as defined in subsection
- 18 (7) of this section which are to be allocated to the district for the
- 19 current school year;
- 20 (c) Divide the amount in (b) of this subsection by the district's
- 21 levy base to compute a new percentage; and
- 22 (d) The percentage in (c) of this subsection or twenty percent,
- 23 whichever is greater, shall be the district's maximum levy percentage
- 24 for levies collected in that calendar year.
- 25 (7) "Levy reduction funds" shall mean increases in state funds from
- 26 the prior school year for programs included under subsection (4) of
- 27 this section: (a) That are not attributable to enrollment changes,
- 28 compensation increases, or inflationary adjustments; and (b) that are
- 29 or were specifically identified as levy reduction funds in the
- 30 appropriations act. If levy reduction funds are dependent on formula

- 1 factors which would not be finalized until after the start of the
- 2 current school year, the superintendent of public instruction shall
- 3 estimate the total amount of levy reduction funds by using prior school
- 4 year data in place of current school year data. Levy reduction funds
- 5 shall not include moneys received by school districts from cities or
- 6 counties.
- 7 (8))) For the purposes of this section, "prior school year" shall
- 8 mean the most recent school year completed prior to the year in which
- 9 the levies are to be collected.
- 10 $((\frac{9}{}))$ (6) For the purposes of this section, "current school year"
- 11 shall mean the year immediately following the prior school year.
- 12 (((10))) The superintendent of public instruction shall develop
- 13 rules and regulations and inform school districts of the pertinent data
- 14 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
