SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1934

- 1 AN ACT Relating to pedestrians; and amending RCW 46.61.055 and
- 2 46.61.060.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 46.61.055 and 1990 c 241 s 2 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 Whenever traffic is controlled by traffic control signals
- 7 exhibiting different colored lights, or colored lighted arrows,
- 8 successively one at a time or in combination, only the colors green,
- 9 red and yellow shall be used, except for special pedestrian signals
- 10 carrying a word or legend, and said lights shall indicate and apply to
- 11 drivers of vehicles and pedestrians as follows:
- 12 (1) Green indication
- 13 (a) Vehicle operators facing a circular green signal may proceed
- 14 straight through or turn right or left unless a sign at such place
- 15 prohibits either such turn. But vehicle operators turning right or

- 1 left shall stop to allow other vehicles or pedestrians at school
- 2 <u>crossings</u> lawfully within the intersection control area to complete
- 3 their movements. <u>Vehicles turning right or left shall also stop to</u>
- 4 <u>allow a pedestrian lawfully within the intersection control area to</u>
- 5 cross when the pedestrian is upon the half of the roadway upon which
- 6 the vehicle is traveling.
- 7 (b) Vehicle operators facing a green arrow signal, shown alone or
- 8 in combination with another indication, may enter the intersection
- 9 control area only to make the movement indicated by such arrow, or such
- 10 other movement as is permitted by other indications shown at the same
- 11 time. The vehicle operators shall stop to allow other vehicles or
- 12 pedestrians at school crossings lawfully within the intersection
- 13 control area to complete their movements. <u>Vehicle operators shall also</u>
- 14 stop to allow a pedestrian lawfully within the intersection control
- 15 area to cross when the pedestrian is upon the half of the roadway upon
- 16 which the vehicle is traveling.
- 17 (c) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal, as
- 18 provided in RCW 46.61.060 as now or hereafter amended, pedestrians
- 19 facing any green signal, except when the sole green signal is a turn
- 20 arrow, may proceed across the roadway within any marked or unmarked
- 21 crosswalk.
- 22 (2) Steady yellow indication
- 23 (a) Vehicle operators facing a steady circular yellow or yellow
- 24 arrow signal are thereby warned that the related green movement is
- 25 being terminated or that a red indication will be exhibited immediately
- 26 thereafter when vehicular traffic shall not enter the intersection.
- 27 (b) Pedestrians facing a steady circular yellow or yellow arrow
- 28 signal, unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal as
- 29 provided in RCW 46.61.060 shall not enter the roadway((, but)).
- 30 <u>However</u>, if pedestrians have begun to cross before the display of

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- 1 either signal, vehicle operators shall stop to allow them to ((complete
- 2 their movements)) cross when the pedestrian is upon the half of the
- 3 roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling. If pedestrians have begun
- 4 to cross at a school crossing before the display of either signal,
- 5 <u>vehicle operators shall stop to allow them to complete their movements</u>.
- 6 (3) Steady red indication
- 7 (a) Vehicle operators facing a steady circular red signal alone
- 8 shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering
- 9 the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or, if none, then
- 10 before entering the intersection control area and shall remain standing
- 11 until an indication to proceed is shown. However, the vehicle
- 12 operators facing a steady circular red signal may, after stopping
- 13 proceed to make a right turn from a one-way or two-way street into a
- 14 two-way street or into a one-way street carrying traffic in the
- 15 direction of the right turn; or a left turn from a one-way or two-way
- 16 street into a one-way street carrying traffic in the direction of the
- 17 left turn; unless a sign posted by competent authority prohibits such
- 18 movement((; but)). Vehicle operators planning to make such turns shall
- 19 remain stopped to allow other vehicles lawfully within or approaching
- 20 the intersection control area, or approaching pedestrians lawfully
- 21 within an adjacent ((crosswalk)) school crossing, to complete their
- 22 movements. <u>Vehicle operators shall also stop to allow a pedestrian</u>
- 23 <u>lawfully within an adjacent crosswalk to cross when the pedestrian is</u>
- 24 upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling.
- 25 (b) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal as
- 26 provided in RCW 46.61.060 as now or hereafter amended, pedestrians
- 27 facing a steady circular red signal alone shall not enter the roadway.
- 28 (c) Vehicle operators facing a steady red arrow indication may not
- 29 enter the intersection control area to make the movement indicated by
- 30 such arrow, and unless entering the intersection control area to make

such other movement as is permitted by other indications shown at the 1 same time, shall stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, 2 3 before entering a crosswalk on the near side of the intersection 4 control area, or if none, then before entering the intersection control area and shall remain standing until an indication to make the movement 5 6 indicated by such arrow is shown. However, the vehicle operators facing a steady red arrow indication may, after stopping proceed to 7 make a right turn from a one-way or two-way street into a two-way 8 9 street or into a one-way street carrying traffic in the direction of 10 the right turn; or a left turn from a one-way street or two-way street into a one-way street carrying traffic in the direction of the left 11 turn; unless a sign posted by competent authority prohibits such 12 movement((; but)). Vehicle operators planning to make such turns shall 13 14 remain stopped to allow other vehicles lawfully within or approaching the intersection control area, or approaching pedestrians lawfully 15 within an adjacent ((crosswalk)) school crossing, to complete their 16 17 movements. Vehicle operators shall also stop to allow a pedestrian 18 lawfully within an adjacent crosswalk to cross when the pedestrian is 19 upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling.

20 (d) Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian signal, pedestrians
21 facing a steady red arrow signal indication shall not enter the
22 roadway.

23 (4) If an official traffic control signal is erected and maintained 24 at a place other than an intersection, the provisions of this section 25 shall be applicable except as to those provisions which by their nature 26 can have no application. Any stop required shall be made at a sign or 27 marking on the pavement indicating where the stop shall be made, but in 28 the absence of any such sign or marking the stop shall be made at the 29 signal.

- 1 Sec. 2. RCW 46.61.060 and 1990 c 241 s 3 are each amended to read
- 2 as follows:
- Whenever pedestrian control signals exhibiting the words "Walk" or
- 4 the walking person symbol or "Don't Walk" or the hand symbol are
- 5 operating, the signals shall indicate as follows:
- 6 (1) WALK or walking person symbol--Pedestrians facing such signal
- 7 may cross the roadway in the direction of the signal. Pedestrians that
- 8 begin to cross a roadway while facing such signal shall be granted the
- 9 right to complete their crossing by all vehicle operators.
- 10 (2) Steady or flashing DON'T WALK or hand symbol--Pedestrians shall
- 11 not enter the roadway, but if pedestrians have begun to cross before
- 12 the display of either signal, vehicle operators shall stop to allow
- 13 them to ((complete their movements)) cross when the pedestrian is upon
- 14 the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling. If
- 15 pedestrians have begun to cross at a school crossing before the display
- 16 of either signal, vehicle operators shall stop to allow them to
- 17 <u>complete their movements</u>.
- 18 (3) Pedestrian control signals having the "Wait" legend in use on
- 19 August 6, 1965, shall be deemed authorized signals and shall indicate
- 20 the same as the "Don't Walk" legend. Whenever such pedestrian control
- 21 signals are replaced the legend "Wait" shall be replaced by the legend
- 22 "Don't Walk".
