## HOUSE BILL 2200

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to providing state funding assistance to school
- 2 districts; adding new sections to chapter 28A.300 RCW; and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The complex needs grant program is
- 6 hereby created. The purpose of the grant program is to provide
- 7 financial assistance to school districts that have a high number of
- 8 students who cost more to educate due to social and economic factors.
- 9 (2) Funds appropriated by the legislature for the purposes of the
- 10 complex needs grant program shall not become a part of the state's
- 11 basic program of education obligation as set forth under Article IX of
- 12 the state Constitution.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Grants under the complex needs grant
- 14 program shall be allocated by a formula adopted by the superintendent

- 1 of public instruction after consultation with representatives of the
- 2 legislature, governors, teachers, administrators, students, school
- 3 board members, and others. Funds, as appropriated by the legislature,
- 4 shall be distributed to school districts qualifying for elements
- 5 specified in this section. The elements of the complex needs formula
- 6 shall include elements specified in LEAP Document 30, as developed by
- 7 the legislative evaluation and accountability program a committee April
- 8 \_\_\_\_\_, 1991, at \_\_\_\_ hours. As used in this section, "LEAP Document 30"
- 9 means the computerized tabulation and formulas for the following
- 10 elements:
- 11 (1) A poverty element based on the ratio of free and reduced meals
- 12 compared to the headcount enrollment of the school district. A minimum
- 13 of sixty-five percent of the students must be participating in free and
- 14 reduced lunch programs for the district to qualify for this funding
- 15 element;
- 16 (2) A special education element based, in part, on the ratio of
- 17 special education students compared to the headcount enrollment of the
- 18 school district. School districts with more than two thousand students
- 19 participating in special education programs shall receive at least
- 20 fifty dollars per weighted special education student. A minimum of
- 21 nine percent of the students must be participating in special education
- 22 programs for a district to qualify for this funding element.
- 23 (3) A bilingual education element based, in part, on the ratio of
- 24 students participating in bilingual education programs compared to
- 25 headcount enrollment of the school district. School districts with
- 26 more than twenty-five thousand headcount enrollment shall receive a
- 27 minimum of one hundred fifty dollars per weighted bilingual student.
- 28 A minimum of nine percent of the district students must be
- 29 participating in bilingual education programs for a district to qualify
- 30 for this funding factor, except that any district with over twenty

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- 1 percent enrollment in bilingual programs shall receive a minimum of
- 2 fifty dollars per student.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Before receiving complex needs grants,
- 4 eligible school districts shall submit the following to the
- 5 superintendent of public instruction:
- 6 (1) Documentation that the district board of directors has held at
- 7 least one public hearing regarding the proposed use of the funds;
- 8 (2) A description of the services, programs, or activities that
- 9 will be funded in whole or in part by the funds, and a proposed budget;
- 10 and
- 11 (3) A description of the methods and procedures to be used to
- 12 evaluate the effectiveness of the services, programs, or activities
- 13 supported by the funds.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) Each school district receiving funds
- 15 under the grant program established under section 1 of this act shall
- 16 submit biennially to the superintendent of public instruction a report
- 17 on the district's use of the funds. The report shall include an
- 18 assessment of the effectiveness of the services, programs, or
- 19 activities supported by the funds and other information required by the
- 20 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public
- 21 instruction shall establish the date for submittal of reports. The
- 22 superintendent of public instruction shall work with the eligible
- 23 districts in developing reporting requirements that do not create
- 24 excessive paperwork but that provide information necessary for the
- 25 legislature to evaluate the effectiveness of the grant program in
- 26 improving the educational outcomes of students with special needs in
- 27 the districts.

- 1 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall submit
- 2 biennially to the legislature a report on the complex needs grant
- 3 program. The first report shall be submitted not later than December
- 4 1, 1993.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The sum of seven million, five hundred
- 6 thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is
- 7 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 1993, to the
- 8 superintendent of public instruction from the general fund for the
- 9 purposes of this act.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Sections 1 through 4 of this act are
- 11 each added to chapter 28A.300 RCW.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** If any provision of this act or its
- 13 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 14 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 15 persons or circumstances is not affected.
