- 1 AN ACT Relating to the disposition of real property by the
- 2 commissioner of public lands; adding a new section to chapter 43.30
- 3 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 79.01 RCW; and declaring an
- 4 emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.30 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (1) The legislature finds that the department of natural resources
- 9 has a need to maintain the real property asset base it manages and
- 10 needs an accounting mechanism to complete transactions without reducing
- 11 the real property asset base.
- 12 (2) The natural resources real property replacement account is
- 13 created in the state treasury. This account shall consist of funds
- 14 transferred or paid for the nonpermanent disposal or transfer of real

- 1 property by the department of natural resources under section 2 of this
- 2 act. The funds in this account shall be used solely for the
- 3 acquisition of replacement real property and may be spent only when,
- 4 and as, authorized by legislative appropriation.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 79.01 RCW
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) For the purposes of this section, "public agency" means any
- 8 agency, political subdivision, or unit of local government of this
- 9 state including, but not limited to, municipal corporations, quasi-
- 10 municipal corporations, special purpose districts, and local service
- 11 districts; any agency of the state government; any agency of the United
- 12 States; and any Indian tribe recognized as such by the federal
- 13 government.
- 14 (2) With the approval of the board of natural resources, the
- 15 department of natural resources may directly transfer or dispose of
- 16 real property, without public auction, in the following circumstances:
- 17 (a) Transfers in lieu of condemnations;
- 18 (b) Transfers to public agencies; and
- 19 (c) Transfers to resolve trespass and property ownership disputes.
- 20 (3) Real property transfers or dispositions made under this section
- 21 must be nonpermanent. Such transfers or dispositions shall be deemed
- 22 nonpermanent transfers or dispositions when the consideration
- 23 transferred or paid is deposited into the natural resources real
- 24 property replacement account created under section 1 of this act and
- 25 used by the department to acquire replacement real property.
- 26 (4) Real property to be transferred or disposed of under this
- 27 section shall be transferred or disposed of only after appraisal and
- 28 for at least fair market value, and only if such transaction is in the
- 29 best interest of the state or affected trust.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 3 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 4 effect immediately.
