- 1 AN ACT Relating to education; and amending RCW 28A.150.410.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 3 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.150.410 and 1990 c 33 s 118 are each amended to
- 4 read as follows:

State of Washington

- 5 (1) The legislature shall establish for each school year in the
- 6 appropriations act a state-wide salary allocation schedule, for
- 7 allocation purposes only, to be used to distribute funds for basic
- 8 education certificated instructional staff salaries under RCW
- 9 28A.150.260.
- 10 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall calculate salary
- 11 allocations for state funded basic education certificated instructional
- 12 staff by determining the district average salary for basic education
- 13 instructional staff using the salary allocation schedule established
- 14 pursuant to this section. However, no district shall receive an

- 1 allocation based upon an average basic education certificated
- 2 instructional staff salary which is less than the average of the
- 3 district's 1986-87 actual basic education certificated instructional
- 4 staff salaries, as reported to the superintendent of public instruction
- 5 prior to June 1, 1987, and the legislature may grant minimum salary
- 6 increases on that base: PROVIDED, That the superintendent of public
- 7 instruction may adjust this allocation based upon the education and
- 8 experience of the district's certificated instructional staff.
- 9 Beginning in the 1992-93 school year, the determination of years of
- 10 service for licensed occupational therapists, physical therapists, and
- 11 <u>nurses shall include experience in schools and also experience in other</u>
- 12 <u>nonschool positions as licensed occupational therapists, physical</u>
- 13 therapists, and/or nurses.
- 14 (3) Beginning January 1, 1992, no more than ninety college quarter-
- 15 hour credits received by any employee after the baccalaureate degree
- 16 may be used to determine compensation allocations under the state
- 17 salary allocation schedule and LEAP documents referenced in the
- 18 biennial appropriations act, or any replacement schedules and
- 19 documents, unless:
- 20 (a) The employee has a masters degree; or
- 21 (b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations
- 22 before January 1, 1992.
