- 1 AN ACT Relating to voluntary community service; adding new sections
- 2 to chapter 28A.230 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the education
- 5 of our children must include not only academic and technical skills and
- 6 knowledge, but also the development of character and an understanding
- 7 of our common responsibilities as members of our society and democracy.
- 8 One method for building character and teaching responsibility in our
- 9 students is to encourage them to volunteer in community social,
- 10 governmental, and educational organizations. Increasing the level of
- 11 student volunteerism will strengthen the relationship between schools
- 12 and communities, expand instructional effectiveness, strengthen the
- 13 bonds between young people and adults, and provide enriching, rewarding
- 14 experiences for students.

- 1 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.230
- 2 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 Every high school in the state is encouraged to offer annually the
- 4 opportunity for students to volunteer their services to community
- 5 social and educational organizations. Community social and educational
- 6 organizations include hospitals, nursing homes, food banks, day care
- 7 organizations, state and local government offices, and other
- 8 organizations that provide social, health, educational, and
- 9 governmental services.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.230
- 11 RCW to read as follows:
- 12 (1) The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall
- 13 prepare guidelines for use by schools in programs involving student
- 14 volunteer service in the community.
- 15 (2) At a minimum, the guidelines shall include information of
- 16 assistance to schools in the following areas:
- 17 (a) If a school chooses to offer opportunities for volunteer
- 18 activity, whether volunteer activity should be discretionary on the
- 19 part of the individual student, a noncredit requirement for graduation,
- 20 or count as course credit toward graduation;
- 21 (b) Requirements for volunteer service to count as credit toward
- 22 graduation;
- 23 (c) Certificated endorsement requirements, if any, of supervisory
- 24 educators or others;
- 25 (d) The respective responsibilities of a school and its community
- 26 contacts, including supervision of a student volunteer;
- 27 (e) Liability issues;
- 28 (f) Scheduling; and
- 29 (g) Transportation.
