- 1 AN ACT Relating to metropolitan municipal corporations; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 36.56 RCW; creating a new section; and declaring an
- 3 emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 36.56 RCW
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 As an alternative to the procedure set forth in RCW 36.56.040, the
- 8 county legislative authority in any county with a population of one
- 9 million or more, after notice and public hearing as required by RCW
- 10 36.56.020 and 36.56.030, may by ordinance or resolution assume the
- 11 rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the metropolitan
- 12 municipal corporations. Upon enactment of the ordinance or resolution,
- 13 the county is vested with every right, power, function, and obligation
- 14 currently granted to or possessed by the metropolitan municipal

- 1 corporation, the metropolitan council established under RCW 35.58.120
- 2 through 35.58.160 is abolished, the provisions of RCW 35.58.120 through
- 3 35.58.160 are inapplicable to the county, and the county legislative
- 4 authority is vested with all rights, powers, duties, and obligations
- 5 otherwise vested by law in the metropolitan council. For a county with
- 6 a home rule charter, the rights, powers, duties, and obligations of a
- 7 metropolitan municipal corporation assumed under this section vest in
- 8 accordance with the executive and legislative responsibilities defined
- 9 in the charter.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 36.56 RCW
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 A county that has assumed the functions of a metropolitan municipal
- 13 corporation under section 1 of this act shall comply with all
- 14 provisions of this chapter other than those set forth in RCW 36.56.040,
- 15 and in addition shall:
- 16 (1) Establish two or more intergovernmental committees to review
- 17 and recommend to the county legislative authority the county-wide
- 18 comprehensive policy plan and those elements of other plans which under
- 19 state law are effective in both unincorporated and incorporated areas.
- 20 The committee shall include members representing units of local and
- 21 regional government, including, but not limited to, special purpose
- 22 districts, cities, county, and unincorporated areas. The number of
- 23 central city members, other component city members, and unincorporated
- 24 area members on each committee shall be in proportion to the
- 25 populations of the central city, other component cities, and
- 26 unincorporated area of the county. Central city members shall be
- 27 elected city officials of the central city selected by the central
- 28 city. Other component city members shall be elected city officials of
- 29 the other component cities selected by the other component cities using

- 1 a procedure established by the county. Unincorporated area members
- 2 shall be selected using a procedure established by the county that
- 3 includes a division of the unincorporated area into separate geographic
- 4 areas with the community councils and neighborhood associations within
- 5 each geographic area selecting a representative from that
- 6 unincorporated area. Committee members shall be subject to chapter
- 7 42.17 RCW;
- 8 (2) Until a charter amendment has been approved after the effective
- 9 date of this act altering the size of the county legislative authority
- 10 and providing for a super-majority vote of the county legislative
- 11 authority on matters related to the exercise of metropolitan functions
- 12 under chapter 35.58 RCW, any ordinance, resolution, or other measure
- 13 adopted by the county legislative authority relating to a metropolitan
- 14 municipal corporation right, power, function, or obligation that was
- 15 assumed by the county must be approved by at least a two-thirds vote of
- 16 the members of the county legislative authority;
- 17 (3) Establish a transition committee to advise the county
- 18 legislative authority on issues relating to the transition to county
- 19 performance of metropolitan municipal functions. The transition
- 20 committee shall include members representing cities, special purpose
- 21 districts, and citizens with interest and expertise in metropolitan
- 22 municipal functions and public administration;
- 23 (4) Ensure that revenues and expenditures authorized by state law
- 24 solely for metropolitan municipal corporation purposes are preserved
- 25 and accounted for separate from other county funds and expended solely
- 26 for purposes authorized by chapter 35.58 RCW or as otherwise provided
- 27 by state or federal law;
- 28 (5) Preserve for a period of two years from the effective date of
- 29 the assumption of metropolitan municipal functions by the county the

- 1 existing internal administrative structure of the metropolitan
- 2 municipal corporation; and
- 3 (6) Conduct a process for consultation with citizens of
- 4 unincorporated areas of the county to analyze issues of governance for
- 5 such areas and report to the legislature and the governor regarding any
- 6 necessary proposed legislation to implement the conclusions of the
- 7 process within one year from the effective date of the assumption of
- 8 metropolitan municipal functions by the county.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** For decades, the primary focus and
- 10 responsibilities of county government have been in the unincorporated
- 11 portion of the county. It is the intent of the legislature when a
- 12 county assumes a greater role as a regional government that the focus
- 13 of the county be extended to the entire county as a single region and
- 14 the interests of all the citizens of the entire county.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 16 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 17 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 18 effect immediately.
