- 1 AN ACT Relating to commercial salmon licenses; amending RCW
- 2 75.28.035 and 75.30.120; adding a new section to chapter 75.30 RCW;
- 3 creating a new section; and providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that
- 6 commercial salmon fishing is an important part of the state's tradition
- 7 and economy but that trends in resource depletion and actions by the
- 8 federal government protecting numerous species threaten the industry's
- 9 long-term viability. Since it is in the best interest of the state to
- 10 maintain an economically viable and stable commercial salmon fishing
- 11 industry, the legislature finds that a reduction in the number of
- 12 commercial salmon fishing licenses would provide a positive benefit to
- 13 the state, the commercial salmon industry, and particularly the

- 1 individual commercial salmon fishers for whom fishing is the primary
- 2 source of livelihood.
- 3 (2) The legislature realizes that a reduction in the number of
- 4 commercial salmon licenses should be phased in and that the fishing
- 5 industry itself should play a key role in deciding how the reduction
- 6 occurs. It is the legislature's goal to achieve the numbers of
- 7 commercial salmon licenses specified in section 2 of this act by the
- 8 year 2000.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 75.30 RCW
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 (1) The department of fisheries, in close consultation with the
- 12 commercial salmon fishing industry, shall develop a plan to reduce the
- 13 number of commercial salmon fishing licenses to meet the target number
- 14 of commercial salmon fishing licenses indicated in subsection (2) of
- 15 this section by January 1, 2000.
- 16 (2) The targets for the following licenses are:
- 17 (a) Salmon troll 100
- 18 (b) Puget Sound gill net 250
- 19 (c) Puget Sound purse seine 100
- 20 (d) Puget Sound reef net 50
- 21 (e) Grays Harbor and Columbia river gill net 75
- 22 (f) Willapa Harbor and Columbia river gill net 125
- 23 (g) Salmon charterboat 180
- 24 (3) The plan shall be presented to the legislature not later than
- 25 January 1, 1993.
- 26 Sec. 3. RCW 75.28.035 and 1989 c 316 s 1 are each amended to read
- 27 as follows:

- 1 An application for issuance or renewal of a commercial fishing
- 2 license shall contain the name and address of the vessel owner, the
- 3 name and address of the vessel operator, the name and number of the
- 4 vessel, a description of the vessel and fishing gear to be carried on
- 5 the vessel, and other information required by the department.
- 6 At the time of issuance of a commercial fishing license the
- 7 director shall furnish the licensee with a vessel registration and two
- 8 license decals.
- 9 Vessel registrations and license decals issued by the director
- 10 shall be displayed as provided by rule of the director.
- 11 A commercial fishing license is not valid if the vessel is operated
- 12 by a person other than the operator listed on the license. The
- 13 director may authorize additional operators for the license. Unless
- 14 adjusted by the director pursuant to the director's authority granted
- 15 in RCW 75.28.065, the fee for an additional operator is twenty
- 16 dollars((-)) except when the following gear is used for commercial
- 17 <u>salmon fishing:</u>

- 23 The vessel owner shall notify the director on forms provided by the
- 24 department of changes of ownership or operator and a new license shall
- 25 be issued upon payment of a transfer fee of twenty dollars except that
- 26 for salmon purse seine, salmon gill net, and salmon troll the fee is

- 1 two hundred fifty dollars for a new owner or one hundred dollars for a
- 2 transfer from one vessel to another not involving a new owner.
- A defaced, mutilated, or lost license or license decal shall be
- 4 replaced immediately. Unless adjusted by the director pursuant to the
- 5 director's authority granted in RCW 75.28.065, the replacement fee is
- 6 ten dollars.
- 7 **Sec. 4.** RCW 75.30.120 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 46 s 146 are each
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (1) A commercial salmon fishing license issued under RCW 75.28.110
- 10 or salmon delivery permit issued under RCW 75.28.113 may be issued only
- 11 to a vessel:
- 12 (a) Which held a state commercial salmon fishing license or salmon
- 13 delivery permit during the previous year or had transferred to the
- 14 vessel such a license, and has not subsequently transferred the license
- 15 or permit to another vessel; and
- 16 (b) From which ((food fish)) salmon were caught and landed in this
- 17 state ((or in another state)) during the previous year in at least the
- 18 <u>following poundage</u> as documented by a valid <u>food</u> fish receiving
- 19 document((-)) <u>issued by the department:</u>

- 1 Where the failure to obtain the license or permit during the
- 2 previous year was the result of a license or permit suspension, the
- 3 vessel may qualify for a license or permit by establishing that the
- 4 vessel held such a license or permit during the last year in which the
- 5 license or permit was not suspended.
- 6 (2) The director may waive the landing requirement of subsection
- 7 (1)(b) of this section if:
- 8 (a) The vessel to which an otherwise valid license is transferred
- 9 has not had the opportunity to have caught and landed salmon; and
- 10 (b) The intent of the commercial salmon vessel limitation program
- 11 established under this section is not violated.
- 12 (3) Commercial salmon fishing licenses and salmon delivery permits
- 13 are transferable.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Section 4 of this act shall take effect
- 15 January 1, 1993.
