- 1 AN ACT Relating to the registration of geologists; adding a new
- 2 chapter to Title 18 RCW; and making an appropriation.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** In order to safeguard life, health, and
- 5 property, and to promote the public welfare, the legislature finds that
- 6 it is in the public interest to regulate the profession of geology as
- 7 described in this chapter. No person may practice or offer to practice
- 8 the profession of geology unless registered or exempted from
- 9 registration as provided by this chapter.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **Sec. 2.** As used in this chapter, the following
- 11 terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section:
- 12 "Board" means the board of registration for geologists.

- 1 "Geologist" means a person who, by reason of his or her knowledge
- 2 of geology, mathematics, and the supporting physical and life sciences,
- 3 acquired by education and practical experience, is qualified to engage
- 4 in the practice of geology.
- 5 "Geology" means the science that includes treatment of the earth
- 6 and its origin and history, in general; the investigation of the
- 7 earth's constituent rocks, minerals, solids, fluids including surface
- 8 and underground waters, gases, and other materials; and the study of
- 9 natural agents, forces, and processes that cause changes in the earth.
- 10 "Practice of geology" means performance of geological service or
- 11 work including, but not limited to, consultation, investigation,
- 12 evaluation, planning, surveying, mapping, and inspection of geological
- 13 work, and the responsible supervision thereof, the performance of which
- 14 is related to public welfare or the safeguarding of life, health,
- 15 property, and the environment, except as otherwise specifically
- 16 provided by this chapter. A person shall be construed to practice or
- 17 offer to practice geology, within the meaning and intent of this
- 18 chapter, who practices any branch of the profession of geology; or who
- 19 by verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, card, or in any other
- 20 way represents himself or herself to be a geologist; or through the use
- 21 of some other title that implies that he or she is a geologist or that
- 22 he or she is registered under this chapter; or who holds himself or
- 23 herself out as able to perform or who does perform any geologic
- 24 services or work recognized by the board as the practice of geology.
- 25 "Registered geologist" means a geologist who has met the academic
- 26 and experience qualifications established pursuant to this chapter and
- 27 who has been issued a certificate of registration as a geologist by the
- 28 board.

- 1 "Responsible charge" means the independent control and direction,
- 2 by use of initiative, skill, and independent judgment, of geological
- 3 work or the supervision of such work.
- 4 "Subordinate" means any person who assists in the practice of
- 5 geology by a registered geologist or an exempt person, without assuming
- 6 the responsible charge of the work.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** There is hereby created within the
- 8 department of licensing, the board of registration for geologists. The
- 9 board shall be composed of seven members, to be appointed by the
- 10 governor. Six of the members shall be geologists registered pursuant
- 11 to this chapter; the seventh member shall be a lay member of the
- 12 general public with no family or business connection to the practice of
- 13 geology. Each member of the board shall be a citizen of the United
- 14 States, shall have been a resident of this state for at least three
- 15 years immediately preceding his or her appointment, and shall be at
- 16 least twenty-five years of age. In making appointments to the board,
- 17 the governor shall make every effort to see that women and minorities
- 18 are appropriately represented. The members initially appointed to the
- 19 board shall be exempt from the registration requirement.
- 20 Members of the board shall be appointed for terms of four years,
- 21 except for the initial board appointments which shall be made as
- 22 follows: The first appointee shall serve a term of one year; the
- 23 second and third appointees shall serve terms of two years; the fourth
- 24 and fifth appointees shall serve terms of three years; and the sixth
- 25 and seventh appointees shall serve terms of four years. Members shall
- 26 serve on the board until the expiration of the term for which they were
- 27 appointed and until their successors have been appointed and qualified.
- 28 No member of the board may serve more than two consecutive full terms.

- 1 Vacancies in the membership of the board shall be filled for the
- 2 unexpired term by gubernatorial appointment.
- 3 The governor may remove or suspend any member of the board for any
- 4 of the following causes: (1) If the member is no longer qualified for
- 5 appointment to the board; (2) misconduct, incompetence, neglect of
- 6 official duties, or malfeasance; (3) commission of a felony or
- 7 violation of the provisions of this chapter resulting in disciplinary
- 8 action; or (4) an unexcused failure to attend at least one-half of the
- 9 regularly scheduled meetings held in a calendar year during the
- 10 member's term in office.
- 11 Each member of the board shall be compensated in accordance with
- 12 RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in
- 13 carrying out provisions of this chapter in accordance with RCW
- 14 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- 15 Each present and former member of the board, its agents, employees,
- 16 and members of committees duly appointed by the board under this
- 17 chapter to assist the board in carrying out its duties and
- 18 responsibilities, shall be exempt from civil liability for any act or
- 19 omission occurring while acting in an official capacity, and the
- 20 attorney general shall defend any such person in any action against the
- 21 board or such person arising from any such act or omission.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) The board shall meet within sixty
- 23 days after appointment of its members. The board shall hold at least
- 24 two regular meetings each year. Special meetings shall be held at such
- 25 time as the rules of the board may provide and in accordance with the
- 26 notice requirements thereof. The board shall elect annually from its
- 27 membership, a chair, a vice-chair, and a secretary-treasurer, none of
- 28 whom shall hold that office for more than two consecutive one-year
- 29 terms. The board may employ personnel and arrange for assistance as it

- 1 requires to carry out its duties and responsibilities under this
- 2 chapter. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum.
- 3 (2) The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW for
- 4 the administration of this chapter, the performance of its duties, the
- 5 governing of its proceedings, and the regulation of the practice of
- 6 geology in this state.
- 7 (3) The board shall have the following powers and duties:
- 8 (a) The board shall establish fees to be charged applicants and
- 9 registrants in connection with and to support the administration and
- 10 enforcement of this chapter. The board shall set its fees at a level
- 11 adequate to pay the costs of administering this chapter. In addition,
- 12 the board shall charge additional fees for the purpose of repaying the
- 13 board's initial general fund appropriation within a reasonable amount
- 14 of time;
- 15 (b) The board shall consider all applications for registration as
- 16 a geologist;
- 17 (c) The board shall prepare, administer, and grade, or cause to be
- 18 prepared, administered, and graded, oral and written examinations
- 19 required or established by this chapter. The board may adopt or
- 20 recognize, in whole or in part, examinations prepared, administered, or
- 21 graded by other organizations that the board determines are appropriate
- 22 measures of the qualifications of an applicant for registration in this
- 23 state as a geologist;
- 24 (d) The board shall issue certificates of registration as provided
- 25 in this chapter;
- 26 (e) The board shall renew and reissue certificates of registration
- 27 as provided in this chapter. As a condition of reissuance or renewal,
- 28 the board shall have the authority to require evidence of continued
- 29 competence in the practice of geology through means such as but not
- 30 limited to the review of qualifications and experience, requirements

- 1 for continuing professional education, or by reexamination on a
- 2 periodic or other basis;
- 3 (f) The board shall adopt and issue a code of professional conduct
- 4 that shall be binding upon all registrants and others permitted to
- 5 practice geology under the limitations of this chapter;
- 6 (g) The board shall have the authority to investigate all
- 7 complaints of violations of this chapter and of unprofessional conduct,
- 8 by registrants and nonregistrants, as provided in this chapter;
- 9 (h) The board shall have the authority to refuse issuance or
- 10 renewal of or to suspend or revoke any certificate, and to impose
- 11 sanctions or disciplinary actions for violations of this chapter;
- 12 (i) The board shall have the authority to administer oaths and
- 13 affirmations, and to issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of
- 14 witnesses and the production of evidence. The board shall also have
- 15 the authority to issue cease and desist orders and to seek injunctions
- 16 against violations of this chapter;
- 17 (j) The board may work with the boards of registration of other
- 18 states, and with other appropriate organizations and agencies, for the
- 19 purposes of developing uniform standards for the registration of
- 20 geologists; establishing reciprocity of registration; developing
- 21 regional or national examinations; evaluating applicants; or other
- 22 purposes consistent with this chapter; and
- 23 (k) The board shall have other powers and authority as are
- 24 necessary for the administration and enforcement of this chapter.
- 25 (4) The board shall publish and maintain a roster showing the names
- 26 and places of business of all registered geologists and firms or
- 27 corporations practicing under certificates of registration issued by
- 28 the board.

- 1 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The board shall determine by rule what
- 2 information applicants must submit in support of an application for
- 3 registration as a geologist. The board shall also determine by rule
- 4 the requirements that an applicant must meet in order to receive a
- 5 certificate of registration as a geologist. In determining these
- 6 requirements, the board shall consider an applicant's education and
- 7 experience, and an applicant's score on an examination established by
- 8 the board for the purpose of testing the applicant's knowledge of the
- 9 fundamentals and practice of geology. The board shall adopt rules for
- 10 reexamination and partial reexamination for applicants who have failed
- 11 all or part of the board's required examination.
- 12 In any individual case the board, by a two-thirds vote, may waive
- 13 any of the requirements for registration, except payment of the
- 14 applicable fees, upon written request of an applicant and upon a
- 15 showing of good cause. If the board determines that the applicant is
- 16 qualified for registration as a geologist, the requirements waived and
- 17 the basis for such waiver shall be recorded in the applicant's record
- 18 and in the proceedings of the board.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The board may deny registration to an
- 20 applicant who fails to satisfy any of the requirements established
- 21 pursuant to this chapter, or if the board determines that there is
- 22 probable cause to believe that an applicant has violated this chapter
- 23 or comparable provisions in effect in any other state. The board shall
- 24 not issue a certificate of registration pending the disposition, in
- 25 this or another state, of any complaint alleging a violation of which
- 26 the board has notice.
- 27 An applicant who is denied registration shall be notified in
- 28 writing within thirty days of the board's decision, stating the reason
- 29 for the denial. Within thirty days after receipt of such notice, the

- 1 applicant may make written request for a review hearing before the
- 2 board. In the absence of a request for a hearing, the board's action
- 3 shall be final and conclusive.
- 4 The board shall refund the application fee of any applicant whose
- 5 application has been denied, less the cost of considering the
- 6 application, as determined by the board.
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. The board shall issue a certificate
- 8 evidencing registration as a geologist to an applicant whom the board
- 9 feels has met the requirements established pursuant to this chapter and
- 10 who has paid the applicable fees. The certificate shall show the full
- 11 name of the registrant, shall have a serial number, and shall be signed
- 12 by an appropriate officer of the board. The issuance by the board of
- 13 a certificate of registration is evidence of a certificate holder's
- 14 right to practice geology, so long as the certificate remains unrevoked
- 15 or unexpired.
- 16 Each registrant shall procure a seal or stamp of a design
- 17 established by the board, bearing the registrant's name, serial number,
- 18 and the legend "registered geologist." Geologic reports, documents,
- 19 chain-of-custody records, manifests, permits, affidavits, maps, plans,
- 20 logs, sections, or other public records prepared or issued by or under
- 21 the supervision of a registered geologist, shall include the full name,
- 22 signature, and serial number of the registrant who prepared the
- 23 document or under whose supervision the document was prepared, and an
- 24 impression of the registrant's seal or stamp, in accordance with rules
- 25 established by the board.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** Persons engaged in the following
- 27 activities shall not be required to register under this chapter:

- 1 (1) Geological work performed by an employee or subordinate of a
- 2 registrant under this chapter, so long as the work does not include
- 3 responsible charge of geological work and is performed under the direct
- 4 supervision of a registered geologist, who shall be responsible for
- 5 such work;
- 6 (2) Geological work performed by officers and employees of the
- 7 United States practicing solely as such officers and employees;
- 8 (3) Geological work performed exclusively in the exploration for
- 9 and development of energy resources and base, precious, and nonprecious
- 10 minerals, including sand, gravel, and aggregate;
- 11 (4) Geologic research conducted through academic institutions,
- 12 agencies of the federal or state governments, nonprofit research
- 13 institutions, or for-profit organizations, including submissions of
- 14 research to public agencies;
- 15 (5) Teaching in geology or related physical or natural sciences;
- 16 (6)(a) The acquisition of engineering data involving soil, rock,
- 17 groundwater, and other earth materials; evaluation of the physical and
- 18 chemical properties of soil, rock, ground water, and other earth
- 19 materials; and utilization of these data in analysis, design, and
- 20 construction by professional engineers registered and licensed in this
- 21 state, and (b) similar geological work performed by persons or
- 22 organizations licensed or registered in any other profession or
- 23 occupation related to geology, provided such work is permitted under
- 24 the applicable licensing or registration law, and is incidental to the
- 25 practice or the profession or occupation for which licensure and
- 26 registration is required;
- 27 (7) Work customarily performed by such physical or natural
- 28 scientists and chemists, archaeologists, geographers, oceanographers,
- 29 and soil scientists; and

- 1 (8) The giving of testimony, or preparation and presentation of
- 2 exhibits or documents for the sole purpose of being placed in evidence
- 3 before any administrative or judicial tribunal or hearing, provided
- 4 that the testimony, exhibits, or documents do not imply that the person
- 5 is a registered geologist under this chapter.
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. This chapter shall be known and may be
- 7 cited as "The Washington registration of geologists act."
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** Sections 1 through 9 of this act shall
- 9 constitute a new chapter in Title 18 RCW.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 11.** If any provision of this act or its
- 11 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 12 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 13 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 12.** The sum of seventy-five thousand
- 15 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for
- 16 the biennium ending June 30, 1993, from the general fund to the
- 17 department of licensing for the purposes of administering the
- 18 registration of geologists act.
