- 1 AN ACT Relating to the use of physician's assistants by licensed
- 2 physicians and licensed osteopathic physicians; and amending RCW
- 3 18.71A.020 and 18.57A.020.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 Sec. 1. RCW 18.71A.020 and 1990 c 196 s 2 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) The board shall adopt rules fixing the qualifications and the
- 8 educational and training requirements for persons who may be employed
- 9 as physician assistants or who may be enrolled in any physician
- 10 assistant training program. The requirements shall include completion
- 11 of an accredited physician assistant training program approved by the
- 12 board and eligibility to take an examination approved by the board,
- 13 provided such examination tests subjects substantially equivalent to
- 14 the curriculum of an accredited physician assistant training program.

- 1 Physician assistants licensed by the board on June 7, 1990, shall
- 2 continue to be licensed.
- 3 (2)(a) The board shall adopt rules governing the extent to which:
- 4 (i) Physician assistant students may practice medicine during
- 5 training; ((and))
- 6 (ii) Physician assistants may practice after successful completion
- 7 of a physician assistant training course; and
- 8 <u>(iii) The use of a physician's assistant is allowed under the</u>
- 9 <u>supervision and control of an osteopathic physician licensed under</u>
- 10 <u>chapter 18.57 RCW</u>.
- 11 (b) Such rules shall provide:
- 12 (i) That the practice of a physician assistant shall be limited to
- 13 the performance of those services for which he or she is trained; and
- 14 (ii) That each physician assistant shall practice medicine only
- 15 under the supervision and control of a physician licensed in this
- 16 state, but such supervision and control shall not be construed to
- 17 necessarily require the personal presence of the supervising physician
- 18 at the place where services are rendered.
- 19 Sec. 2. RCW 18.57A.020 and 1971 ex.s. c 30 s 8 are each amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 The board shall adopt rules and regulations fixing the
- 22 qualifications and the educational and training requirements for
- 23 persons who may be employed as osteopathic physician's assistants or
- 24 who may be enrolled in any physician's training program.
- The board shall, in addition, adopt rules and regulations governing
- 26 the extent to which physician's assistants may practice medicine during
- 27 training and after successful completion of a training course. Such
- 28 regulations shall provide:

1 (1) That the practice of an osteopathic physician's assistant shall

be limited to the performance of those services for which he or she is

- 3 trained; ((and))
- 4 (2) That each osteopathic physician's assistant shall practice
- 5 medicine only under the supervision and control of an osteopathic
- 6 physician licensed in this state, but such supervision and control
- 7 shall not be construed to necessarily require the personal presence of
- 8 the supervising physician at the place where services are rendered; and
- 9 (3) For the use of an osteopathic physician's assistant under the
- 10 <u>supervision and control of a physician licensed under chapter 18.71</u>
- 11 <u>RCW.</u>
