- 1 AN ACT Relating to the Washington technology center; amending RCW
- 2 28B.20.285; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.20.285 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 72 s 11 are each
- 5 amended to read as follows:

State of Washington

- 6 ((A)) (1) The Washington ((high-technology)) technology center is
- 7 created to be a collaborative effort between the state's colleges and
- 8 universities, private industry, and government. The center shall be
- 9 <u>headquartered</u> at the University of Washington. <u>The mission of the</u>
- 10 Washington technology center shall be to perform research, and to help
- 11 implement its commercialization, on a state-wide basis that benefits
- 12 the intermediate and long-term economic vitality of the state of
- 13 Washington, and to develop and strengthen university-industry
- 14 relationships through the conduct of research that is primarily of

- 1 interest to Washington-based companies or state economic development
- 2 <u>priorities</u>. The Washington ((high-technology)) technology center shall
- 3 ((provide)): (((1) An interdisciplinary program to support major high-
- 4 technology education and research initiatives within the state))
- 5 (a) Perform research supportive of state science and technology
- 6 needs and objectives, particularly as they relate to state industries;
- 7 ((2) the resources necessary for research and development programs in
- 8 high technology))
- 9 (b) Provide leading edge collaborative research and technology
- 10 <u>transfer opportunities</u>, <u>primarily to state industries</u>; (((3) quality))
- 11 <u>(c) Provide opportunities for</u> training ((for advanced))
- 12 undergraduate and graduate students ((in high technology)) through
- 13 <u>direct involvement in research and industry interactions;</u>
- 14 (d) Emphasize and develop nonstate support of the Washington
- 15 <u>technology center's research mission</u>; and (((4) interdisciplinary
- 16 approaches to instruction and research in high-technology fields))
- 17 <u>(e) Provide a forum for effective interaction between the state's</u>
- 18 technology-based industries and its academic research institutions
- 19 through promotion of faculty collaboration with the state's industries,
- 20 particularly within the state.
- 21 ((The Washington high technology center shall be administered by
- 22 the board of regents with the advice of the high-technology
- 23 coordinating board)) The department of trade and economic development
- 24 shall provide guidance to the Washington technology center regarding
- 25 <u>development of the center's strategic plan</u>. The department shall be
- 26 responsible to the legislature for the contractual performance of the
- 27 <u>center</u>. <u>Under contract with the department of trade and economic</u>
- 28 <u>development</u>, the <u>University of Washington</u>, through the board of
- 29 regents, shall be responsible for the administration of the Washington
- 30 technology center. The Washington technology center's board of

- 1 directors shall be responsible for the policy making and oversight of
- 2 the operations of the center. The center's executive director shall
- 3 report to the center's board of directors. The Washington technology
- 4 center shall report quarterly, through the office of the provost at the
- 5 University of Washington, to the department of trade and economic
- 6 <u>development regarding the center's activities</u>, and the center shall
- 7 submit annually to the department an updated strategic plan and a
- 8 statement of performance measured against the mission, roles, and
- 9 contractual obligations of the Washington technology center. The
- 10 University of Washington shall make the facilities of the Washington
- 11 ((high-technology)) technology center available to other institutions
- 12 of higher education when specific program needs so require.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 14 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 15 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 16 effect immediately.
