- 1 AN ACT Relating to outdoor burning regulation duties of fire
- 2 districts and fire protection districts; and amending RCW 70.94.745 and
- 3 70.94.750.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.94.745 and 1991 c 199 s 401 are each amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 It shall be the responsibility and duty of the department of
- 8 natural resources, department of ecology, department of agriculture,
- 9 ((fire districts,)) and local air pollution control authorities to
- 10 establish, through regulations, ordinances, or policy, a limited
- 11 burning program for the people of this state, consisting of a one-
- 12 permit system, until such time as alternate technology or methods of
- 13 disposing of the organic refuse have been developed that are reasonably
- 14 economical and less harmful to the environment. It is the policy of

- 1 this state to foster and encourage development of alternate methods or
- 2 technology for disposing of or reducing the amount of organic refuse.
- 3 Sec. 2. RCW 70.94.750 and 1991 c 199 s 412 are each amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 The following outdoor fires described in this section may be burned
- 6 subject to the provisions of this chapter and also subject to city
- 7 ordinances, county resolutions, ((rules of fire districts)) and
- 8 laws(()) and rules enforced by the department of natural resources if
- 9 a permit has been issued by a $((fire\ protection\ agency,))$ county((,))
- 10 or conservation district:
- 11 (1) Fires consisting of leaves, clippings, prunings and other yard
- 12 and gardening refuse originating on lands immediately adjacent and in
- 13 close proximity to a human dwelling and burned on such lands by the
- 14 property owner or his or her designee.
- 15 (2) Fires consisting of residue of a natural character such as
- 16 trees, stumps, shrubbery or other natural vegetation arising from land
- 17 clearing projects or agricultural pursuits for pest or disease control;
- 18 provided the fires described in this subsection may be prohibited in
- 19 those areas having a general population density of one thousand or more
- 20 persons per square mile.
