- 1 AN ACT Relating to contractor registration requirements; adding a
- 2 new section to chapter 18.27 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 19.28
- 3 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 18.106 RCW; creating a new
- 4 section; and providing an effective date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 18.27 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (1) Every applicant registering as a contractor under this chapter
- 9 for the first time shall be required to attend an educational seminar
- 10 on laws applicable to the business of contracting in the state of
- 11 Washington. The seminar shall be presented by the department of
- 12 revenue and shall emphasize the state tax reporting requirements.
- 13 Where practical, the seminar shall include presentations by other state
- 14 agencies and may be cosponsored by the contractors' organizations.

- 1 (2) Every applicant renewing a registration under this chapter
- 2 shall be required to attend an educational seminar as provided in
- 3 subsection (1) of this section at least once every four years.
- 4 (3) The department of revenue shall certify the attendance of each
- 5 contractor to the department of labor and industries.
- 6 (4) The failure of a contractor to attend a seminar under
- 7 subsection (1) of this section within six months of his or her initial
- 8 registration shall be grounds for revocation of that contractor's
- 9 registration.
- 10 (5) The failure of a contractor renewing his or her registration to
- 11 attend a seminar as required in subsection (2) of this section at least
- 12 once every four years shall be grounds for revocation of that
- 13 contractor's registration.
- 14 (6) The department of revenue is authorized to require the
- 15 attendance of any contractor with a demonstrated compliance problem at
- 16 a seminar as provided in subsection (1) of this section at the first
- 17 available time and place once the problem has been discovered.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 19.28 RCW
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 (1) Every applicant receiving a license as an electrical contractor
- 21 under this chapter for the first time shall be required to attend an
- 22 educational seminar on laws applicable to the business of contracting
- 23 in the state of Washington. The seminar shall be presented by the
- 24 department of revenue and shall emphasize the state tax reporting
- 25 requirements. Where practical, the seminar shall include presentations
- 26 by other state agencies and may be cosponsored by the electrical
- 27 contractors' organizations.

- 1 (2) Every applicant renewing a license under this chapter shall be
- 2 required to attend an educational seminar as provided in subsection (1)
- 3 of this section at least once every four years.
- 4 (3) The department of revenue shall certify the attendance of each
- 5 electrical contractor to the department of labor and industries.
- 6 (4) The failure of an electrical contractor to attend a seminar
- 7 under subsection (1) of this section within six months of his or her
- 8 initial registration shall be grounds for revocation of that
- 9 contractor's registration.
- 10 (5) The failure of an electrical contractor renewing his or her
- 11 registration to attend a seminar at least once every four years as
- 12 required in subsection (2) of this section shall be grounds for
- 13 revocation of that contractor's registration.
- 14 (6) The department of revenue is authorized to require the
- 15 attendance of any electrical contractor with a demonstrated compliance
- 16 problem at a seminar as provided in subsection (1) of this section at
- 17 the first available time and place once a problem has been discovered.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 18.106 RCW
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 (1) Every applicant receiving a certificate of competency as a
- 21 plumber contractor under this chapter for the first time shall be
- 22 required to attend an educational seminar on laws applicable to the
- 23 business of contracting in the state of Washington. The seminar shall
- 24 be presented by the department of revenue and shall emphasize the state
- 25 tax reporting requirements. Where practical, the seminar shall include
- 26 presentations by other state agencies and may be cosponsored by the
- 27 plumbers' organizations.

- 1 (2) Every applicant renewing a certificate under this chapter shall
- 2 be required to attend an educational seminar as provided in subsection
- 3 (1) of this section at least once every four years.
- 4 (3) The department of revenue shall certify the attendance of each
- 5 plumber contractor to the department of labor and industries.
- 6 (4) The failure of a plumber to attend a seminar under subsection
- 7 (1) of this section within six months of his or her initial
- 8 certification shall be grounds for revocation of that plumber's
- 9 certification.
- 10 (5) The failure of a plumber renewing his or her certification to
- 11 attend a seminar as required in subsection (2) of this section at least
- 12 once every four years shall be grounds for revocation of that plumber's
- 13 certification.
- 14 (6) The department of revenue is authorized to require the
- 15 attendance of any plumber with a demonstrated compliance problem at a
- 16 seminar as provided in subsection (1) of this section at the first
- 17 available time and place once the problem has been discovered.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The department of revenue shall conduct
- 19 a study of compliance with the excise tax laws within the construction
- 20 industry. The study shall place special emphasis on the causes or
- 21 reasons for noncompliance. The department shall report the findings of
- 22 the study to committees of the legislature that deal with contractors
- 23 and revenue no later than January 6, 1994.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992.
