## HOUSE BILL 2967

- 1 AN ACT Relating to medicaid funding of intermediate care
- 2 facilities; adding a new chapter to Title 82 RCW; creating a new
- 3 section; making an appropriation; providing an expiration date;
- 4 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** As used in this act, "expiration date"
- 7 means the earliest of:
- 8 (1) The date that federal medicaid matching funds for the purposes
- 9 specified in section 7 of this act become unavailable or are
- 10 substantially reduced, as such date is certified by the secretary of
- 11 social and health services; or
- 12 (2) The date that federal medicaid matching funds for the purposes
- 13 specified in section 7 of this act become unavailable or are

- 1 substantially reduced, as determined by a permanent injunction, court
- 2 order, or final court decision.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 4 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 5 chapter.
- 6 (1) "Gross income" means all income from whatever source derived,
- 7 including but not limited to gross income of the business as defined in
- 8 RCW 82.04.080 and moneys received from state appropriations.
- 9 (2) "Intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded" means an
- 10 intermediate care facility certified by the department of social and
- 11 health services and the federal department of health and human services
- 12 to provide residential care under 42 U.S.C. Sec. 1396d(d).
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** In addition to any other tax, a tax is
- 14 imposed on every intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded
- 15 for the act or privilege of engaging in business within this state.
- 16 The tax is equal to the gross income attributable to services for the
- 17 mentally retarded, multiplied by the rate of fifteen percent.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Chapter 82.32 RCW applies to the tax
- 19 imposed in this chapter. The tax due dates, reporting periods, and
- 20 return requirements applicable to chapter 82.04 RCW apply equally to
- 21 the tax imposed in this chapter.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Sections 2 through 4 of this act shall
- 23 constitute a new chapter in Title 82 RCW.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** (1) Sections 2 through 4 of this act
- 2 shall expire on the expiration date determined under section 1 of this
- 3 act.
- 4 (2) The expiration of sections 2 through 4 of this act shall not be
- 5 construed as affecting any existing right acquired or liability or
- 6 obligation incurred under those sections or under any rule or order
- 7 adopted under those sections, nor as affecting any proceeding
- 8 instituted under those sections.
- 9 (3) Taxes that have been paid under sections 2 through 4 of this
- 10 act, but are properly attributable to taxable events occurring after
- 11 the expiration of those sections, shall be credited or refunded as
- 12 provided in RCW 82.32.060.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** (1) The sum of seventeen million eighty-
- 14 eight thousand dollars from the general fund--state and the sum of
- 15 twenty million eight hundred eighty-six thousand dollars from the
- 16 general fund--federal are appropriated for the biennium ending June 30,
- 17 1993, to the developmental disabilities program of the department of
- 18 social and health services for prospective rate increases for
- 19 intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded to cover the
- 20 medicaid share of the tax under section 3 of this act.
- 21 (2) The appropriations in this section shall lapse on the
- 22 expiration date determined under section 1 of this act. Amounts that
- 23 have been paid under this subsection, but are properly attributable to
- 24 a period after that expiration date, shall be repaid or credited to the
- 25 state as provided in rules of the department of revenue.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 28 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take

1 effect April 1, 1992.
