- 1 AN ACT Relating to funding of water pollution control; amending RCW
- 2 70.146.080 and 90.50A.020; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 70.146.080 and 1991 sp.s. c 16 s 923 are each amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Within thirty days after June 30, 1987, and within thirty days
- 7 after each succeeding fiscal year thereafter, the state treasurer shall
- 8 determine the tax receipts deposited into the water quality account for
- 9 the preceding fiscal year. ((If the tax receipts deposited into the
- 10 account in each of the fiscal years 1988 and 1989 are less than forty
- 11 million dollars, the state treasurer shall transfer sufficient moneys
- 12 from general state revenues into the water quality account to bring the
- 13 total receipts in each fiscal year up to forty million dollars.))

- 1 For the biennium ending June 30, 1991, if the tax receipts
- 2 deposited into the water quality account and the earnings on investment
- 3 of balances credited to the account are less than ninety million
- 4 dollars, the treasurer shall transfer sufficient moneys from general
- 5 state revenues into the water quality account to bring the total
- 6 revenue up to ninety million dollars. The determination and transfer
- 7 shall be made by July 31, 1991, but during the 1991-93 biennium the
- 8 <u>legislature may subsequently direct the treasurer to transfer up to</u>
- 9 that same amount back to the general fund.
- For fiscal year $((\frac{1992}{1993}))$ and thereafter, if the tax receipts
- 11 deposited into the water quality account for each fiscal year are less
- 12 than forty-five million dollars, the ((treasurer shall)) legislature
- 13 <u>may direct the</u> transfer <u>of</u> sufficient moneys from general state
- 14 revenues into the water quality account to bring the total revenue to
- 15 up to forty-five million dollars. Determinations and transfers shall
- 16 be made by July 31 for the preceding fiscal year.
- 17 **Sec. 2.** RCW 90.50A.020 and 1991 sp.s. c 13 s 102 are each amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (1) The water pollution control revolving fund is hereby
- 20 established in the ((custody of the)) state ((treasurer)) treasury.
- 21 Moneys in this fund ((are not subject to)) may be spent only after
- 22 legislative appropriation. Moneys in the fund may be spent only in a
- 23 manner consistent with this chapter.
- 24 (2) The water pollution control revolving fund shall consist of:
- 25 (a) All capitalization grants provided by the federal government
- 26 under the federal water quality act of 1987;
- 27 (b) All state matching funds appropriated or authorized by the
- 28 legislature;

- 1 (c) Any other revenues derived from gifts or bequests pledged to
- 2 the state for the purpose of providing financial assistance for water
- 3 pollution control projects;
- 4 (d) All repayments of moneys borrowed from the fund;
- 5 (e) All interest payments made by borrowers from the fund;
- 6 (f) Any other fee or charge levied in conjunction with
- 7 administration of the fund; and
- 8 (g) Any new funds as a result of leveraging.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 10 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 11 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 12 effect immediately.
