SUBSTITUTE HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4410

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

By House Committee on Fisheries & Wildlife (originally sponsored by Representatives R. King, Wilson, Morris, D. Sommers, Winsley, Horn, H. Myers, Nelson and Orr).

Read first time March 6, 1991.

- 1 WHEREAS, There were five petitions filed early in 1990 to have five
- 2 salmon populations in the Columbia river drainage listed under the
- 3 provisions of the federal endangered species act; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The decline of the five salmon populations is due to a
- 5 variety of factors, including low flows, insufficient habitat, hatchery
- 6 stock management, and fishing; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Interested and affected parties are attempting to develop
- 8 a plan to recover these salmon populations; and
- 9 WHEREAS, There may be over fifty other populations of salmon and
- 10 steelhead in Washington that are in danger of extinction;
- 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of
- 12 the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That a joint select
- 13 committee on salmon and steelhead recovery be established to review the
- 14 status of salmon and steelhead populations in Washington, to determine
- 15 the reasons for decline of populations, to make recommendations for
- 16 action needed to recover each population in Washington, and to

- 1 determine the feasibility of using dislocated timber workers for any
- 2 recommended habitat enhancement; and
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of eight
- 4 members, two members from the house of representatives committee on
- 5 fisheries and wildlife and two members from the house of
- 6 representatives committee on natural resources, to be appointed by the
- 7 speaker of the house of representatives, and four members from the
- 8 senate committee on environment and natural resources, to be appointed
- 9 by the president of the senate; and
- 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall
- 11 request advice and information from the public and private sectors, to
- 12 include at a minimum, representatives from the following: Department of
- 13 wildlife, department of fisheries, department of natural resources,
- 14 department of agriculture, employment security department, American
- 15 fisheries society, Indian tribes, commercial fishing community,
- 16 recreational fishing community, Northwest power planning council,
- 17 environmental community, timber industry, agricultural industry,
- 18 organized labor, economic development associations, and utility
- 19 companies; and
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall use
- 21 legislative staff and facilities, but may hire additional staff with
- 22 specific technical expertise if such expertise is necessary to carry
- 23 out the mandates of this resolution. All expenses of the committee,
- 24 including travel, shall be paid jointly by the senate and the house of
- 25 representatives; and
- 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and
- 27 recommendations to the legislature by December 1, 1991; and
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee shall expire July 1,
- 29 1992.
