HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4413

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

By Representatives R. King, Wilson and Anderson.

Read first time April 10, 1991. Referred to Committee on Fisheries & Wildlife.

- 1 WHEREAS, In 1987 the department of game became the department of
- 2 wildlife; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Additional revenues from the general fund resulted in
- 4 additional attention being placed on wildlife issues of interest to the
- 5 general public, such as habitat and nongame species; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The funding of the department is inadequate to satisfy all
- 7 constituents of the department, including consumptive and
- 8 nonconsumptive users of the wildlife resource; and
- 9 WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of the people and wildlife of
- 10 the state of Washington to add to and broaden the department of
- 11 wildlife's funding base to allow all sectors of the public to
- 12 contribute to wildlife and to allow wildlife and habitat to be
- 13 adequately protected;
- 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of
- 15 the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That a joint select
- 16 committee on the department of wildlife be established to review the
- 17 following:

- 1 (1) An examination of sources of funding, and an evaluation of how
- 2 funds from each funding source are used within each division or within
- 3 each program of the department of wildlife, with particular attention
- 4 to how funding sources and programs are separated into traditional
- 5 game-related programs such as hunting and fishing and programs of
- 6 general public benefit;
- 7 (2) An examination of funding for information and education
- 8 programs;
- 9 (3) An evaluation of whether funding for the department is adequate
- 10 to conduct needed programs, as determined by the department;
- 11 (4) An evaluation of the organization and structure of the
- 12 department;
- 13 (5) An evaluation of how public input is used by the department to
- 14 shape management policies and procedures; and
- 15 (6) A determination of whether research and surveys conducted by
- 16 the department are adequate to conduct sound wildlife management; and
- 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of twelve
- 18 members selected as follows: Four shall be members of the Senate
- 19 Environment and Natural Resources Committee, two from each of the two
- 20 largest political caucuses, selected by the President of the Senate;
- 21 four shall be members of the House of Representatives Fisheries and
- 22 Wildlife Committee, two from each of the two largest political
- 23 caucuses, selected by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; two
- 24 from the Senate Ways and Means Committee, one from each of the two
- 25 largest political caucuses, selected by the President of the Senate;
- 26 and two from the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee, one
- 27 from each of the two largest political caucuses, selected by the
- 28 Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
- 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall use
- 30 legislative staff and facilities, but may hire additional staff with

- 1 specific technical expertise if such expertise is necessary to carry
- 2 out the mandates of this resolution. All expenses of the committee,
- 3 including travel, shall be paid jointly by the Senate and the House of
- 4 Representatives. All expenses and hiring of additional staff shall be
- 5 subject to the approval of the House of Representatives Executive Rules
- 6 Committee and the Senate Facilities and Operations Committee as
- 7 required by Joint Rule 26; and
- 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the joint select committee shall
- 9 report its findings and recommendations regarding needed changes in the
- 10 responsibilities, mandates, organization, management, and funding of
- 11 the department of wildlife to the legislature by December 1, 1992; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee shall expire July 1,
- 13 1993.
