HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4431

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

Read first time 03/04/92. Referred to Committee on RULES REVIEW.

- 1 WHEREAS, The Teachers' Retirement System, Plan I, and the Public
- 2 Employees' Retirement System, Plan I, allow members to retire at ages
- 3 younger than 65 after completing a certain number of years of public
- 4 service; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Persons who retire in their 50's may receive benefits for
- 6 over thirty years, and inflation can greatly reduce the purchasing
- 7 power of the initial benefit over that length of time; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Persons who retire under the Teachers' Retirement System,
- 9 Plan I, or the Public Employees' Retirement System, Plan I, are not
- 10 eligible for postretirement cost of living adjustments until the
- 11 purchasing power of their benefit has declined to 60 percent of the
- 12 purchasing power of the benefit received at the age of 65, even if they
- 13 retired in their 50's; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Securing adequate health insurance coverage is one of the
- 15 most significant concerns for persons of any age, but it is a

- 1 particular concern for retirees who have a higher need for health care
- 2 services; and
- 3 WHEREAS, For a number of years, the cost of health insurance has
- 4 been rising at more than double the rate of increase of the cost of
- 5 other goods and services; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Federal income and medical assistance through Social
- 7 Security and Medicare does not occur until retirees are 65 or older;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, The purchasing power of state-provided retirement benefits
- 10 and the availability of affordable and adequate health insurance
- 11 coverage are inseparable issues;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of
- 13 the State of Washington, the Senate concurring, That a Task Force on
- 14 Postretirement Issues is created to study and evaluate the availability
- 15 of and alternatives for supplementation of basic retirement benefits,
- 16 including health benefits, through federal, state, employer, and
- 17 individual resources; and
- 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force comprise six members of
- 19 the House of Representatives and six members of the Senate, with two
- 20 members from each of the four caucuses who serve on the Appropriations
- 21 Committee of the House of Representatives or the Ways and Means
- 22 Committee of the Senate, and one member from each of the four caucuses
- 23 who serves on both the Joint Committee on Pension Policy and the
- 24 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives or the Ways
- 25 and Means Committee of the Senate; and
- 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the chair of the Task Force be elected
- 27 by the members of the Task Force; and
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Appropriations Committee of the
- 29 House of Representatives, the Ways and Means Committee of the Senate,

- 1 and the Joint Committee on Pension Policy provide staff support for the
- 2 Task Force; and
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force make its report and
- 4 recommendations to the Legislature by January 31, 1993.
