- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, On August 2, 1990, Iraq's military invaded, and to the
- 9 present has occupied, Kuwait; and
- 10 WHEREAS, United States troops were initially sent by President Bush
- 11 to the Persian Gulf to defend Saudi Arabia from invasion; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The economic embargo against Iraq, which is already having
- 13 an observable impact, was instituted with the understanding that it
- 14 would require as much as a year to have its intended effect; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Peaceful diplomatic initiatives are being attempted by the
- 16 United Nations, members of the Arab League, and the United States; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Presently, the United States, Iraq, and many other
- 2 countries are poised for a deadly confrontation as a result of the
- 3 United Nations Security Council's Resolution authorizing military force
- 4 after January 15, 1991; and
- 5 WHEREAS, War is an irreversible and devastating action that
- 6 according to estimates will result in United States casualties of ten
- 7 to fifty thousand Americans, in addition to the death and injury of
- 8 countless civilian men, women, and children and soldiers from other
- 9 countries; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The cost of this war, which will run in the billions of
- 11 dollars, and skyrocketing petroleum prices will have a devastating
- 12 effect on our weakening national and state economies, hindering our
- 13 ability to address increasing poverty, homelessness, and unemployment,
- 14 and to meet our responsibility for education, medical care,
- 15 transportation, and affordable housing; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Citizens of Washington State are not convinced that all
- 17 diplomatic and nonmilitary avenues have been exhausted to resolve the
- 18 crises in the Persian Gulf and do not wish to see the lives of our
- 19 service men and women sacrificed when a national emergency does not
- 20 exist;
- 21 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully call on President
- 22 George Bush and his administration to rely on peaceful diplomatic
- 23 efforts and allow an additional year for economic sanctions to work and
- 24 initiate no offensive military action during this time period; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully call on our
- 26 Washington State Congressional delegation to withhold consent to any
- 27 offensive military action and advocate for peaceful diplomatic and
- 28 nonmilitary efforts.
- 29 BE IT RESOLVED, That the Senate and House of Representatives of the
- 30 State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, call on the

- 1 Citizens of the State of Washington to contact the President of the
- 2 United States, and their Representatives to the Congress of the United
- 3 States, to voice their concerns about the use of military force in the
- 4 Persian Gulf.
- 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 6 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 7 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 8 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of
- 9 Washington.
