- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Washington State received record rainfalls of up to
- 9 sixteen inches in two different storm events in November 1990; and
- 10 WHEREAS, These rainstorms brought record flooding to seven
- 11 Washington river systems in November 1990; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Governor Booth Gardner declared a State of Emergency in
- 13 nineteen Washington counties; and
- 14 WHEREAS, President George Bush signed a Presidential Disaster
- 15 Declaration to cover these nineteen Washington counties; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Washington State was hit by high winds in an unprecedented
- 17 third storm event on December 26, 1990, through December 28, 1990; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Two hundred sixty government entities in Washington State
- 2 have applied for assistance under the Disaster Declaration; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Over two hundred million dollars in private and public
- 4 damage has occurred during these three storm events across Washington
- 5 State; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Governor Booth Gardner has extended the State of Emergency
- 7 Declaration to cover the third storm event in December 1990; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Governor Booth Gardner has requested that President George
- 9 Bush extend the Presidential Disaster Declaration to cover this third
- 10 storm event; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Washington State citizens and government entities will
- 12 experience even more hardship without the extension of the Presidential
- 13 Disaster Declaration;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that President
- 15 George Bush extend his initial Presidential Disaster Declaration
- 16 affecting Washington State, to include the third storm event of
- 17 December 26, 1990, through December 28, 1990.
- 18 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 19 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 20 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 21 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of
- 22 Washington.
