HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL 4022

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

Read first time March 14, 1991. Referred to Committee on State Government.

- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, The United States Constitution, Article IV, section 3
- 9 states in part that "... no new state shall be formed or erected within
- 10 the jurisdiction of any other state; nor any state be formed by the
- 11 junction of two or more states, or parts of states, without the consent
- 12 of the legislature of states concerned as well as of the congress,";
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, Eastern Washington citizens are often noted for
- 15 disparaging the west side of the state; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Copious amounts of tax moneys flow from the east side of
- 2 the state to the west side of the state, never to be seen or heard from
- 3 again;
- 4 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the
- 5 Congress of the United States consent to the formation of a new
- 6 territory named Lincoln out of the eastern portion of the state of
- 7 Washington, with its western boundary being the crest of the Cascade
- 8 mountain range, and retain the western portion of the state as the
- 9 state of Washington, with Thomas Foley and Sid Morrison being its first
- 10 joint governors, and that after sufficient time has elapsed for the
- 11 territory of Lincoln to grow up, it may become a full-fledged state of
- 12 the union, as soon as it has paid its dues, subject to the following
- 13 conditions:
- 14 (1) The new capital of Lincoln territory shall be Ritzville, in
- 15 honor of the famous cracker;
- 16 (2) The city of Yakima shall change its name to Caesar Chavez, in
- 17 honor of its favorite son;
- 18 (3) The Tri-Cities shall be consolidated into one city to be known
- 19 as Fondaville, in honor of regional cooperation;
- 20 (4) The territorial tree shall be the telephone pole, in honor of
- 21 this memorial being wired;
- 22 (5) The territorial university located at Pullman shall join the
- 23 Big Sky conference, in honor of its outstanding accomplishments on the
- 24 gridiron in a cat fight against its big brother, an acknowledged
- 25 athletic superior, which is located on an old dump;
- 26 (6) The territorial fruit shall be the crabapple, in honor of its
- 27 attitude toward its ALARming big brother;
- 28 (7) The territorial seed shall be the hayseed, in honor of its
- 29 accomplishments;

- 1 (8) Use of the territorial motor vehicle fuel tax shall be limited
- 2 to public transit purposes, in honor of its miles of roads to nowhere,
- 3 and that the transit system provide door-to-door after-hours services
- 4 for transporting scholars from their field studies in Moscow back to
- 5 their abodes in Pullman;
- 6 (9) The territorial flower shall be garlic, in honor of its hot
- 7 air;
- 8 (10) The territorial soil shall be sand, in honor of its true grit
- 9 and its major geologic feature;
- 10 (11) The territorial deodorant shall be Arid Extra Dry, in honor of
- 11 this being water under the bridge;
- 12 (12) The territorial building shall be the dual occupancy outhouse,
- 13 in recognition of the territorial citizens' companionable attitude
- 14 toward those with environmental concerns;
- 15 (13) The territorial fence shall be barbed wire, in honor of the
- 16 sharp wits of its legislators;
- 17 (14) The territorial bird shall be the Old Crow, in honor of its
- 18 ability to gloat and in the hope that this memorial does not get
- 19 bottled up;
- 20 (15) The motto of the territory of Lincoln shall be "Well, I'll be
- 21 dammed"; and
- 22 (16) The county and city of Walla Walla shall both be known as
- 23 Walla, for being without the western half of Washington state it will
- 24 be only half the place it used to be.
- 25 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 26 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 27 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 28 House of Representatives, and to each member of Congress from the State
- 29 of Washington.
