- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE SECRETARY OF THE
- 5 UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION:
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 7 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, Increasing traffic congestion, decreased air quality, and
- 10 both the actual and perceived impacts of single occupant vehicle travel
- 11 are increasingly serious problems in our nation's cities; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Public transportation and shared ride alternatives are
- 13 increasingly critical elements in both the infrastructure and the
- 14 quality of life of our nation's cities; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The primary form of public transportation is and will
- 2 continue to be provided using standard production model urban transit
- 3 buses; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Urban transit buses have continued to evolve to address
- 5 customer comfort, accessibility, safety, longevity, ease of operation
- 6 and maintenance, and both energy and environmental sensitivity; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The vast majority of urban transit buses are purchased
- 8 using combinations of federal grant funds and both state and local
- 9 assistance; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The suppliers and operators of the nation's urban transit
- 11 buses must simultaneously comply with a complex array of federal,
- 12 state, and local laws, mandates, and regulations; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The combination of customer demands and expectations,
- 14 local operating conditions, and adherence to all regulatory
- 15 requirements, has caused the overall weight of standard production
- 16 urban transit buses to continue to increase, in many cases beyond that
- 17 allowed by current federal and state laws; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The combined goals, operations, and regulatory
- 19 requirements on the public transportation industry have come into
- 20 marked conflict with each other; and
- 21 WHEREAS, It is in the nation's interest to preserve and enhance the
- 22 viability of the mass transportation infrastructure in our cities and
- 23 towns; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The State of Washington and its public transportation
- 25 industry wish to work cooperatively with the federal government to
- 26 resolve the issues related to overweight urban transit buses;
- 27 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the
- 28 Congress act to assure necessary coordination and assistance from the
- 29 Federal Transportation Administration and the Federal Highway
- 30 Administration on the issue of overweight urban transit buses from a

- 1 national perspective. Such intervention would help resolve the growing
- 2 conflicts of federal statutory and regulatory requirements for design,
- 3 safety, and operating features that have increased urban transit bus
- 4 weight. Both manufacturers and mass transit providers urgently need
- 5 consistent nation-wide interpretation which is realistic, cost-
- 6 effective, and sensitive to the growing dilemma being faced at the
- 7 local operating level.
- 8 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 9 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 10 States, the Secretary of the United States Department of
- 11 Transportation, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker
- 12 of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the
- 13 State of Washington.
