- 1 AN ACT Relating to the death penalty for crimes committed in
- 2 furtherance of serious violations of the uniform controlled substances
- 3 act; and amending RCW 10.95.020.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 10.95.020 and 1981 c 138 s 2 are each amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 A person is guilty of aggravated first degree murder if he or she
- 8 commits first degree murder as defined by RCW 9A.32.030(1)(a), as now
- 9 or hereafter amended, and one or more of the following aggravating
- 10 circumstances exist:
- 11 (1) The victim was a law enforcement officer, corrections officer,
- 12 or fire fighter who was performing his or her official duties at the
- 13 time of the act resulting in death and the victim was known or

- 1 reasonably should have been known by the person to be such at the time
- 2 of the killing;
- 3 (2) At the time of the act resulting in the death, the person was
- 4 serving a term of imprisonment, had escaped, or was on authorized or
- 5 unauthorized leave in or from a state facility or program for the
- 6 incarceration or treatment of persons adjudicated guilty of crimes;
- 7 (3) At the time of the act resulting in death, the person was in
- 8 custody in a county or county-city jail as a consequence of having been
- 9 adjudicated guilty of a felony;
- 10 (4) The person committed the murder pursuant to an agreement that
- 11 he or she would receive money or any other thing of value for
- 12 committing the murder;
- 13 (5) The person solicited another person to commit the murder and
- 14 had paid or had agreed to pay money or any other thing of value for
- 15 committing the murder;
- 16 (6) The victim was:
- 17 (a) A judge; juror or former juror; prospective, current, or former
- 18 witness in an adjudicative proceeding; prosecuting attorney; deputy
- 19 prosecuting attorney; defense attorney; a member of the ((board of
- 20 prison terms and paroles)) indeterminate sentence review board; or a
- 21 probation or parole officer; and
- 22 (b) The murder was related to the exercise of official duties
- 23 performed or to be performed by the victim;
- 24 (7) The person committed the murder to conceal the commission of a
- 25 crime or to protect or conceal the identity of any person committing a
- 26 crime;
- 27 (8) There was more than one victim and the murders were part of a
- 28 common scheme or plan or the result of a single act of the person;
- 29 (9) The murder was committed in the course of, in furtherance of,
- 30 or in immediate flight from one of the following crimes:

- 1 (a) Robbery in the first or second degree;
- 2 (b) Rape in the first or second degree;
- 3 (c) Burglary in the first or second degree;
- 4 (d) Kidnapping in the first degree; ((or))
- 5 (e) Arson in the first degree; or
- 6 (f) A violation of the uniform controlled substances act under RCW
- 7 <u>69.50.401(a)(1)(i) and/or (b)(1)(i);</u>
- 8 (10) The victim was regularly employed or self-employed as a
- 9 newsreporter and the murder was committed to obstruct or hinder the
- 10 investigative, research, or reporting activities of the victim.
